Dear Member of Congress:

As a diverse coalition of immigration, faith, labor, human rights and community organizations serving and advocating on behalf of immigrant victims of domestic violence, human trafficking, sexual assault, dating violence, and stalking we write to express our grave concerns and opposition to H.R. 4970, the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2012 (VAWA) (Adams, R-FL).

As passed by the House Judiciary Committee, H.R. 4970 effectively eradicates protections that have been available for almost twenty years to immigrant victims of violence leaving them vulnerable and at risk of further harm for their abusers.

Enacted in 1994 and reauthorized twice in 2000 and 2005, VAWA has a long history of uniting lawmakers with the common purpose of protecting survivors of domestic violence. When VAWA was first conceived, Congress recognized that the noncitizen status of battered immigrants can make them particularly vulnerable to crimes of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, and stalking. The abusers of undocumented immigrants often exploit the victims' immigration status, leaving the victim afraid to seek services or report the abuse to law enforcement and making them fearful of assisting with the investigation and prosecution of these crimes. Congress sought to address this through the enactment of provisions in VAWA that enhance safety for victims and their children and provide an important tool for law enforcement to investigate and prosecute crimes.

HR 4970 endangers victims, and undoes years of bipartisan progress made in previous VAWA legislation by once again taking us to a time before 1994 when abusers were allowed to use immigration status a tool for further abuse.

The changes proposed in H.R. 4970 to VAWA's current protections for immigrant survivors eliminate important confidentiality protections, undermine current anti-fraud protections, and roll back years of progress and commitment on the part of Congress to protect vulnerable immigrant victims.

VAWA, including the immigration provisions, has always been focused on protecting victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and trafficking; this should not change. On Wednesday, when H.R. 4970 is brought to the floor of the House of Representatives, we urge you to vote **NO** to H.R. 4970, a law that is <u>not VAWA</u> as it goes against the core of VAWA by eliminating protections for victims and placing victims in danger.

Each year the lives of hundreds of women, children, and others who fall victim to domestic violence, human trafficking, sexual assault, dating violence and stalking are made safer by important programs the law created. On their behalf and on behalf of all others who will depend upon VAWA in years to come, we ask for your vigilance in preserving VAWA's central purpose.

Because of the serious concerns outlined above, the full House must act to defeat these dangerous amendments to VAWA that curtail protections and ensure continued abuse. We ask you and all members of Congress to strongly oppose H.R. 4970.
