- 1,500 employees, headquarters in Rockville Maryland, plus ten regional offices.

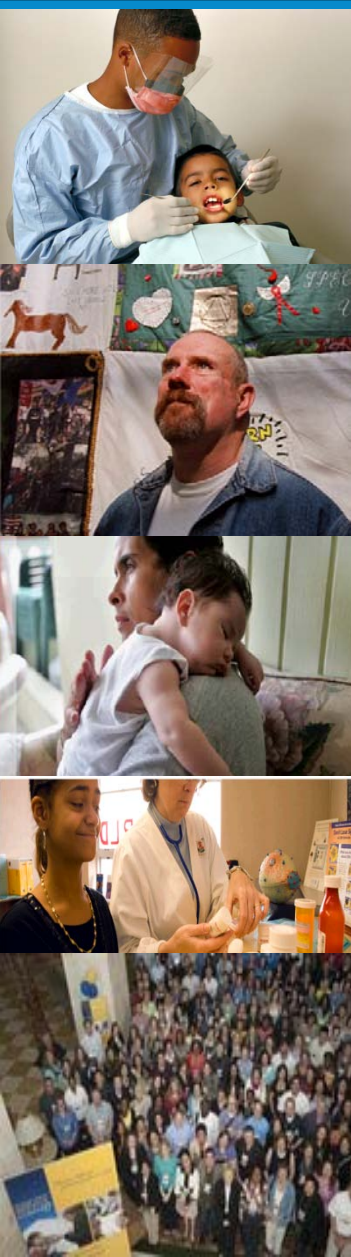

The People We Serve

- Over 19 million patients are served through HRSA-funded health centers, including 1 in 3 people with incomes below the poverty level.
- Over 500,000 people living with HIV/AIDS receive HRSA's Ryan White services. Two-thirds are members of minority groups.
- 34 million women, infants, children, and adolescents benefit from HRSA's maternal and child health programs.
- About 14,000 safety net providers participate in HRSA's 340B program that provides access to discount drug purchases.
- Currently more than 10,000 National Health Service Corps clinicians are working in underserved areas in exchange for loan repayment or scholarships.

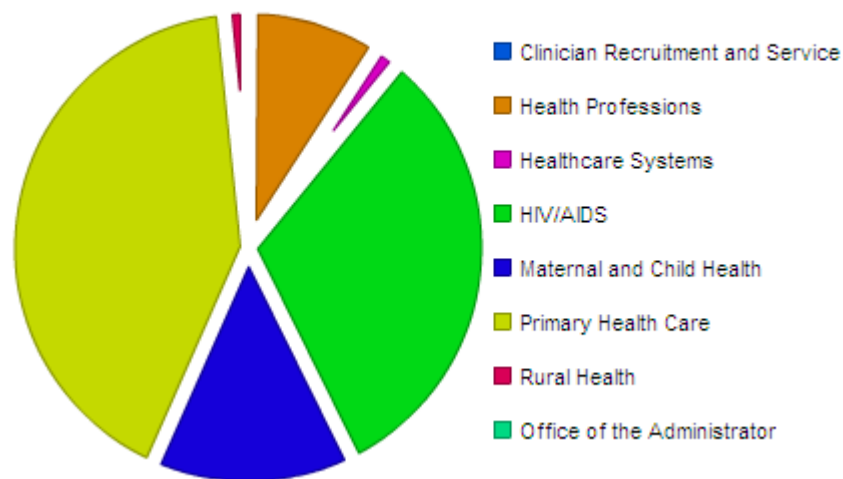


HRSA Grant Awards, 2011

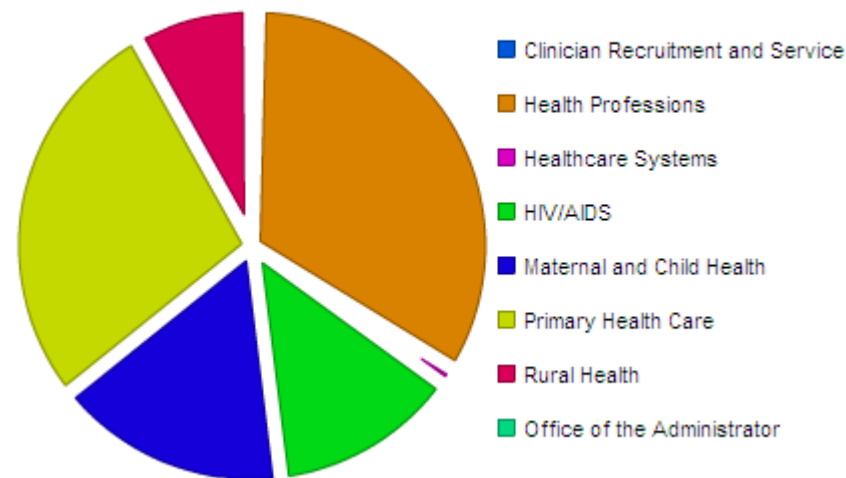

The Department of Health and Human Services' Grants Forecast is a database of **planned** grant opportunities proposed by its [agencies](#). Each Forecast record contains actual or estimated dates and funding levels for grants that the agency intends to award during the fiscal year. Forecast opportunities are **subject to change** based on enactment of congressional appropriations.

When funding is available and an agency is ready to accept applications, the agency will issue an official notice, known as a Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA), which will be available on Grants.gov. The FOA provides guidance on how to receive an application kit and instructions on how to apply.

Affordable Care Act - Grants for School-based Health Center Capital Program

- Capital funds to improve service delivery and support the expansion of services at school-based health centers.
- FY 2013 awards totaling \$75 million.
- May be used for renovation, construction, and/or the purchase of moveable equipment.
- May NOT be used for health services, personnel, or other operational expenses.
- Applications due June 26, 2012 (proj. award date 12/1)



Mental and Behavioral Health Education and Training Grants

- Aims to increase the number of social workers and psychologists who pursue clinical work with high need and high demand populations.
- Eligible applicants are accredited programs of Social Work & Doctoral Psychology.
- \$10 Million (\$480,000 max award) funded through the Affordable Care Act, Prevention & Public Health fund.
- Start date Sept. 30, 2012, end date Sept. 29, 2015.
- Application due June 22, 2012

Scholarships for Disadvantaged Students

- Promotes diversity among health professions by providing scholarships to full-time students with financial need from disadvantaged backgrounds.
- Eligible applicants are accredited schools of medicine, dentistry, nursing, physician assistant, pharmacy, optometry, veterinary medicine, public health, chiropractic, or allied health.
- \$45 Million available
- Application due date June 22, 2012

Children's Hospitals Graduate Medical Education (CHGME) Payment Program

- Eligible applicants are children's teaching hospitals.
- \$268 Million available
- Application due date July 13, 2012

Coordinating Center for Interprofessional Education and Collaborative Practice (IPECP)

- Provide an infrastructure for leadership, expertise, and support to enhance the coordination and capacity building of IPECP among health professions, particularly in medically underserved areas.
- Eligible applicants for this cooperative agreement represent a consortia or a partnership of entities such as a health professions school and a healthcare facility.
- \$800,000 available for 1 award.
- Application due date July 20, 2012



Community Health Centers

- CHCs provide comprehensive primary, preventive, and supplemental health care services in medically underserved areas.
- Affordable Care Act authorized \$11 billion in funding over 5 years for the operation, expansion, and construction of health centers.
- Serve 19.5 million patients, 40% uninsured.
- In 2010 employed more than 131,000 staff

Community Health Center Service Area Competition (SAC)

- Eligible Organizations include public or nonprofit entities.
- FY 2013 SAC awards approximately \$346 million to an estimated 220 applicants.
- All available service areas are currently served by Health Center Program grantees whose project periods are ending in FY2013
- Twenty-five service areas in California are being competed for FY 2013.

Community Health Center New Access Point

- New delivery service sites for the provision of primary, preventive, and supplemental health care services including oral health, mental health, and substance abuse services consistent with the requirements of section 330 of the Public Health Service Act.
- Two types of New Access Points
 - New Start-Organizations
 - Satellite-Organizations
- Announcement of grant awards anticipated in June 2012.
- Additional opportunities anticipated.



National Health Service Corps



The goal of the NHSC is to expand access to health care services and improve the health of people who live areas where health care is scarce.

NHSC recruits a variety of primary care, dental, and mental health providers who are dedicated to serve communities in need. Eligible applicants must be willing to work in designated underserved communities for at least two years.

NHSC provides funding for Scholarships and Loan Repayment for students and health care providers.

National Health Service Corps



Significant Program Expansion

- \$300 million in expansion funds from ARRA
- 10,000 primary care providers in 2011 vs. 3,601 in 2008

Recent Program Improvements

- Simplified site application and approval process
- Max Loan Repayment Award increased to \$60,000 for highest-need areas
- Allowance for Half-Time; 2 & 4 year contracts.

Loan Repayment

- The 2012 NHSC Loan Repayment Application cycle is closed.

Scholarships

- The 2012 NHSC Scholarship application cycle is closed. Decisions will be sent by September 30, 2012. The next application cycle opens spring 2013.

- Funded by the FY 2012 Prevention & Public Health Fund
- Funding for evidence based programs that prevent heart attack, stroke, cancer, diabetes and other leading chronic disease causes of death or disability.
- Approximately \$70 million will be awarded to up to 50 communities.
- Eligible applicants include governmental & non-governmental organizations.
- Closing date July 31, 2012.
