<p>Labor Law Changes: Members amended, 238-186, the National Labor Relations Act to curb union rights and make it easier for companies to shift work to non-union states. A yes vote backed a bill (HR 2587) ending remedies against firms that move work to punish legitimate union activities.</p>		Y	Y	Y	N	N
<p>Charter Schools: Members voted, 365-54, to authorize \$300 million annually through fiscal 2018 for charter schools, which serve about 5 percent of the K-12 students in U.S. public education. A yes vote was to pass a bill (HR 2218) funding learning activities and classroom construction.</p>		Y	Y	Y	Y	N
<p>Green School Construction: Members refused, 195-220, to promote green building practices in the building and renovating of charter schools that would be funded by HR 2218 (above). A yes vote backed the amendment over arguments it would greatly increase construction costs.</p>		Y	N	N	Y	Y
<p>Debt Limit Revisited: Members voted, 232-186, to rescind some of the new U.S. borrowing authority that Congress and President Obama passed in August as the government neared default.
