Dear Mr. Chairman:

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Public Law 111-5 (the Recovery Act), was designed to stimulate economic growth by creating millions of jobs through investments in infrastructure improvements and expanding energy research in an effort to lead the way toward energy independence for our country. On March 20 and April 28, 2009, the Department submitted its initial plans to implement the Recovery Act, identifying specific military construction (MILCON) and facility sustainment, restoration, and modernization (FSRM) projects that improve facilities and energy efficiency.

At that time, the Department indicated that it would amend the plans if significant changes occurred during implementation. This amendment:

- Adds three Army MILCON projects funded with bid savings (enclosure 1),
- Reduces project scope and adds funds to an Air Force Energy Conservation Investment Program MILCON project funded with bid savings (enclosure 2),
- Adds three Air Force MILCON projects funded with bid savings (enclosure 3),
- Realigns funds within the Camp Pendleton hospital project (enclosure 4),
- Adds 35 Air Force FSRM projects funded with bid savings (enclosure 5), and
- Corrects a project title (enclosure 6).

A revised state summary is provided at enclosure 7. The Department appreciates the continued support of the Congress for Defense facility and infrastructure programs. Similar letters have been sent to the chairmen and ranking members of the Senate Armed Services Committee and the Committees on Appropriations of the House and Senate.

The high cost of technology exceeds original estimates and limits replacement to 10 sites.
