THREE DISASTER RECOVERY CENTERS TO CLOSE

RALEIGH, N.C. – Disaster Recovery Centers in Bertie, Bladen and Lee counties will continue to operate for one more week and then close at 5 p.m. Saturday, May 21.

"Our disaster recovery center operations are adjusting hours and locations to serve areas where a need is identified," said Doug Hoell the state's Director of Emergency Management.

Those whose homes or businesses were affected by the April 16 storms and tornadoes can continue to get in-person help at any open Disaster Recovery Center. Hours are 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily except Sunday when centers are closed.
