JUNE 5, 1862.

Mr. GRIMES asked, and by unanimous consent obtained, leave to bring in the following bill; which was read twice, and referred to the Committee on Military Affairs and the Militia.

Reported by Mr. LANE, of Indiana, without amendment.

A BILL

For the establishment of certain national arsenals.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
 2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
 3 That there shall be, and hereby is, established a national
 4 arsenal at Columbus, in the State of Ohio, at Indianapolis, in
 5 the State of Indiana, and ~~at~~^{on} Rock Island, in the State of
 6 Illinois, for the deposit and repair of arms and other muni-
 7 tions of war.

1 SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That for the purpose
 2 of carrying this act into effect, the sum of one hundred thou-
 3 sand dollars for each arsenal named in the preceeding section
 4 be, and the same is hereby, appropriated out of any money
 5 in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

AN ACT

For the establishment of certain national arsenals

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

That there shall be, and hereby is, established a national arsenal at Columbus in the State of Ohio, at Indianapolis, in the State of Indiana, and on Rock Island, in the State of Illinois, for the deposit and repair of arms and other munitions of war. Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That for the purpose of carrying this act into effect, the sum of one hundred thousand dollars for each arsenal named in the preceding section be, and the same is hereby, appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.
