
THE KENNEDY CENTER

There are many ways of traveling to, from, and within Washington, D.C. Here is some helpful information that will hopefully make your trip to the capital safe and enjoyable.

Air Transportation

Reagan National Airport

Located in Arlington, VA across from the Potomac and can be accessed by the blue/yellow lines on the Metro.

Washington Dulles International Airport

Located in Chantilly, VA and has served as a major hub for both domestic and international air travel. Bus access to West Falls Church Metro Station is available via Washington Flyer Coach Service. http://www.washfly.com/coach.html

Ground Transportation

Union Station

Not only does it serve as a central location for ground transportation into the District of Columbia, but it also serves as one of the city's busiest places. Ground transportation includes both bus and train terminals as well as access to the Metrorail

Metrorail and Metrobus

Arguably the most convenient way to travel around the capital. Stations are located throughout the District of Columbia and extend into Maryland and Virginia.
