SCAD Artwork Goes on Display in Congressman Barrow's DC Office

Washington, DC – Brushing up his congressional office with a touch of Savannah, 12th District Representative John Barrow (D-GA) recently turned part of his Washington, DC, office into exhibit space for paintings and artwork from the Savannah College of Art and Design.

The oil based painting currently on display, entitled “Once then, then again,” was painted by Karennia Ness. Her work has been exhibited in several group and solo exhibitions in Savannah, Ga., Louisville, Ky., Moorhead, Minn., and Lacoste, France. She has had several commissioned public works, including a mural in Buffalo, N.D., and a painting in Fargo, N.D.

On display for all visitors and guests, the painting hangs in the reception area of Barrow’s congressional office in Washington. In the coming months, Barrow will work with SCAD to add new artwork, in hopes of showcasing a broad range of different pieces and mediums from the prestigious design school.
