## Networks Ignore Corruption at Liberal Group 2/19

Planned Parenthood All three television networks failed to devote any coverage to videos showing corruption among employees of Planned Parenthood, a liberal group, for an entire week after the controversy broke.

The videos show Planned Parenthood staffers eager to help supposed teenage sex workers get abortions and contraception.

CBS finally covered the controversy a week after the first video was released, but ABC and NBC continued to ignore the story.

## New Book Describes Decline of New York Times

A new book by author William McGowan thoroughly explains the facts and events that have led to the decline of objective reporting at The New York Times.

The book, titled, "Gray Lady Down – What The Decline And Fall Of The New York Times Means For America," gives specific examples of the Times' bias. For example, one section of the book mentions a Media Research Center (MRC) study that found that the Times strongly favored then-Senator Obama over Senator McCain during the 2008 presidential campaign.



MRC found that positive portrayals of Obama in the Times outnumbered negative ones by a three-to-one margin. The ratio was reversed for the Times' portrayal of McCain; it was three-toone negative over positive.
