Liberal Outlets Perpetuated 'Birther' Controversy 5/3/11



The national media often claim that Fox News stoked the controversy surrounding President Obama's birth certificate. However, a study by the nonpartisan Project for Excellence in Journalism found that the opposite is true: Liberal news outlets CNN and MSNBC covered the "birther" story far more frequently than Fox News did.

[']/₁ J. During the week of April 11 through April 17, MSNBC devoted 23 times more airtime than Fox on the birther issue, while CNN devoted 12.5 times as much coverage, according to an analysis of the Pew study reported by the Media Research Center.

This is just the latest example of the national media targeting Fox News, even though the nonpartisan Center for Media and Public Affairs found that Fox is more balanced than any other network. And polls show the public sees Fox as the fairest news outlet.

CBS Gives Only One Side of Tax Issue

During a recent Sunday morning broadcast, CBS News gave a one-sided analysis of the U.S. tax system.

The report devoted significant coverage to those who think the wealthy don't pay enough taxes. However, CBS failed to point out that for the first time ever, the top 1% of earners now pay a larger share of the income tax burden than the bottom 95% of earners. They also neglected to mention that more than one-third of those who file an income tax return pay nothing or even get more back than they put in.

CBS should give Americans the facts, not tell them what to think.
