Another Auto Bailout

Another day, another auto bailout. Last Wednesday, the House passed H.R. 3246, the Advanced Vehicle Technology Act, which spends \$2.85 billion on research to reduce the number of vehicles producing high emissions. This is a worthy goal, but I voted against this bill because it adds to the \$81 billion taxpayers have already spent bailing out the auto industry. Americans already hold a 60% stake in General Motors and 8% in Chrysler. I voted for the Republican alternative that would have prevented double dipping and duplicative funding for vehicle technologies at the Department of Energy, but the motion failed. In my judgment \$3 billion would be better spent by fully funding NASA's mission for space exploration.

Government Takeover of Student Aid

Another day, another government takeover. The House passed the "Student Aid and Fiscal Responsibility Act," which would abolish the longstanding privately-run Federal Family Education Loan (FFEL) and replace it with taxpayer-financed lending from the U.S. Treasury. I have always supported expanding the availability of college aid, but I voted against this bill. By giving the federal government a monopoly over student lending, this plan will eliminate choice, competition, and innovation in our student loan system. Moreover, in an environment where job security is already a concern, this bill will lead to job loss for those involved with the FFEL program.

Border Security

During a Homeland Security subcommittee hearing Thursday, I questioned U.S. Border Patrol Chief David Aguilar about its <u>slow response to security concerns along the U.S.-Mexico border</u>. DHS's SBI*net* includes technology for a virtual fence. However, the technology will not be online in Texas until at least 2014. Meanwhile, Governor Perry's request for 1,000 National Guard troops to help patrol the border, which I support, has gone unanswered by the Obama administration.

Cybersecurity

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This past week Rep. Jim Langevin (D-RI) and I sent a letter to President Obama urging him to expedite his search for a Cybersecurity Coordinator. Jim and I were Congressional Co-Chairs of the Center for Strategic and International Studies' (CSIS) Commission on Cybersecurity for the 44th President that made formal recommendations for securing America's cyberspace. Unfortunately, since the President announced in late May he was acting on our recommendations, there has been little progress. Meanwhile, the computer networks tied to our critical infrastructure remain largely vulnerable to hackers who have escalated the intensity and maliciousness of their attacks in an effort to cause severe economic damage to our country. ACORN

The House overwhelmingly passed a measure to strip the liberal organization ACORN of any federal funding it receives. I voted in favor of this, as no organization which violates federal law should receive taxpayer dollars.
