I head back to Washington after spending Veterans' Day and all of last week home in Texas. This year's observance was marked with deep sadness, as the Fort Hood shootings were a reminder of the daily risks that our men and women in uniform face. Few would have thought our soldiers would face such risk in the safety of their own base.

I had the distinct privilege of attending the Fort Hood memorial service last Tuesday. It was a somber ceremony and a fitting tribute to our fallen soldiers. My heart goes out to the victims, their families and to our military around the world who are experiencing this inexplicable pain. I applaud the President for making clear that no religion or faith justifies such a tragic event and that this killer will be met with justice – in this world and the next. It is on that note that I haveequested an investigation into Nidal Hasan's motivations and outside influences, as there are many indications that Mr. Hasan may have had ties to terrorism. Congress should thoroughly investigate these possible connections and any lack of intelligence sharing between federal agencies over the months leading up to the massacre. Congress should carry out this oversight without delay.
