War in Afghanistan

I applaud the President for his commitment to increasing troop forces in Afghanistan. However, any timeline for withdraw of military forces should be based on conditions on the ground and not on the Washington political clock. On Wednesday, I had the opportunity to question Secretary of Defense Robert Gates, Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and Chairman of the Joint Chiefs Admiral Mike Mullen during a Foreign Affairs Committee hearing. I reiterated the importance of withdrawing from Afghanistan not based on an arbitrary deadline, but on the state of the Afghan people and society. We need to ensure that the people of Afghanistan know that the United States is committed to bring democracy to their nation. Abandoning our commitment only serves to embolden the Taliban and al Qaeda and undermine the overall mission.

Business Act

Last Thursday, I voted against and the House passed H.R. 4154. The death tax was set to expire on January 1, 2010; however, this legislation will keep the death tax at a rate of 45% and the exemption level at \$3.5 million indefinitely. I continue to support a permanent repeal of the death tax. Since it places such a large burden on small business and farmers, its elimination would have a significant and positive impact on our economy and budget. The former director of the non-partisan Congressional Budget Office has projected an estimated increase of 1.5 million small business jobs, an increase of \$1.6 trillion in small business capital, a reduction of the unemployment rate by .9 percent and expanded investment if the death tax were repealed.
