Mickens of Petersburg, Virginia. The Crater Commission represents the localities that surround Fort Lee (cities of Colonial Heights, Hopewell and Petersburg and the counties of Chesterfield, Dinwiddie and Prince George) and it is heavily involved in identifying the impacts of the BRAC-related growth at Fort Lee upon the surrounding localities.
