UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT
Jennifer Walker Elrod (Cal. No. 302)

Ordered, That the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Republican Leader, may proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Jennifer Walker Elrod, of Texas, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Fifth Circuit; that there be a time limitation of 1 hour for debate equally divided between the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary and the Ranking Member, or their designees; that there be an additional 10 minutes each for debate for the Senator from Maryland (Mr. Cardin) and the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. Specter); provided, that at the conclusion, or yielding back of time, the Senate vote on the nomination.

Ordered further, That upon completion of the Elrod nomination, the Senate proceed to vote on each of the following nominations on the Executive Calendar: Roslynn Renee Mauskopf, of New York, to be United States District Judge for the Eastern District of New York; Richard A. Jones, of Washington, to be United States District Judge for the Western District of Washington; and, Sharion Aycock, of Mississippi, to be United States District Judge for the Northern District of Mississippi; provided further, that the motions to reconsider be laid on the table; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate resume legislative session.
