Ordered, That if the Chemical Weapons Convention (Tr. Doc. 103-21) has not been reported by the close of business on April 30, 1996, that the Convention be discharged from the Foreign Relations Committee and placed on the Executive Calendar.

Ordered, That when the Senate resumes executive session to consider the resolution of ratification to the START II TREATY, there be six hours for debate, to be equally divided in the usual form, with unlimited additional time under the control of the Senator from South Carolina (Mr. Thurmond), and that following the conclusion or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote on adoption of the resolution of ratification, without further action or debate.
