The Water Resources and Development Act (WRDA) authorizes projects for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. In most cases, projects must then receive appropriated funds in order to begin or be completed.

New Authorizations:

Arkabutla Lake Corps Visitors Center – Authorization for \$5,550,000 to construct and \$250,000 annually to operate an environmental education center in Hernando, Mississippi.

Choctaw County Lake - Authorization of \$500,000 for a study.

City of Cleveland – Authorization of \$15,000,000 for rehabilitation of a wastewater treatment facility.

George County Lake – Authorization of \$500,000 for a study.

Hinds County - Authorization of \$25,000,000 environmental infrastructure program.

Mid-Delta Water Supply Initiative – Authorization of \$10,000,000 for development of an alternate surface water source for the Mississippi Delta.
