## **About the Internship**

Internships offered in the 10<sup>th</sup> Congressional District allow students to work directly with Georgians who are experiencing problems with federal agencies. Caseworkers act as liaisons between constituents and government agencies, working to resolve individual constituent problem. Interns will have the opportunity to assist our staff in working with federal agencies, such as the Social Security Administration, Veterans Administration and Internal Revenue Service.

Internships in Washington D.C. allow students and recent college graduates to become immersed in the day-to-day of Capitol Hill. Interns assist the DC Staff in varied capacities- from taking a bill to the House floor and compiling research on legislation to attending briefings on behalf of staff. DC interns also receive Capitol Tour training, and guide visiting constituents on Capitol tours.

Additionally, interns in both offices will assist with administrative duties, including filing, answering telephone calls, and maintaining office appearance. Students with excellent communication skills, both verbal and written, as well as strong problem solving skills are encouraged to apply.
