Dear Speaker Boehner, Leader Pelosi, Leader Reid, and Leader McConnell:

As elected officials from a state where thousands of hardworking families benefit from exports, we urge you to reauthorize the Export-Import Bank (Ex-Im) before its charter expires this year. As the official export credit agency of the United States, Ex-Im is a vital export finance tool to the businesses in our state – at no cost to American taxpayers.

Ex-Im allows South Carolina businesses to compete globally on a level playing field. Without Ex-Im, our local businesses will be forced into a global market with foreign competitors that receive extensive support from their own export credit programs. Allowing Ex-Im to expire will deliberately disadvantage American businesses and lead to increased unemployment.

In Fiscal Year 2013, Ex-Im provided over \$27.3 billion in financing, which enabled over \$37 billion in export sales. These exports supported roughly 205,000 American jobs. Moreover, 89% of Ex-Im's transactions in Fiscal Year 2013 involved small businesses.

Meaningful reforms need to be made at Ex-Im and we look forward to improving accountability and oversight at the bank. Failure to reauthorize the agency's operations by September 30, 2014 will place American companies at a serious disadvantage, and would inevitably lead to fewer exports.

We strongly urge you to support legislation reauthorizing Ex-Im. It is the right thing to do for our economy, businesses, and workers.
