

Sectional Analysis

The purpose of the bill is to revise, codify, and enact certain general and permanent laws, related to domestic security, as title 6, United States Code, "Domestic Security". This document contains an analysis of each section of current title 6 that is restated and enacted by the bill. It also lists the disposition of associated provisions of law that are not restated (repealed as obsolete, for example).

Section 3 of the bill restates and enacts the contents of the new title 6 without substantive change from the laws being replaced. This conforms to the statutory specifications for the restatement process (at 2 U.S.C. 285b(1)) that the restated law "conforms to the understood policy, intent, and purpose of the Congress in the original enactments."

General Information

Restatement process. The process of reenacting current laws as a title of the U.S. Code (called "positive law") makes those laws clearer and more accessible: Specifically, the restatement process (1) streamlines and organizes statutory provisions enacted in a fragmentary fashion over time; (2) simplifies citations; (3) corrects errors and clarifies definitional ambiguities and overlaps; (4) eliminates obsolete material; and (5) consolidates law located inappropriately elsewhere in the Code. Significantly (and intentionally as noted above), a restatement does not change the meaning or legal effect of a statute being revised and restated. Standard language changes. Standard language changes are made throughout the revised title. The most significant are summarized here: The law is restated in the present tense and the active voice as far as possible. When there is a choice of two or more words, otherwise of equal legal effect, the more commonly understood word is used. The word "shall" is used in the mandatory and imperative sense. The word "may" is used in the permissive and discretionary sense, as in "is permitted to" and "is authorized to". The words "may not" are used in a prohibitory sense, as in "is not authorized to" and "is not permitted to". The words "person may not" mean that no person is required, authorized, or permitted to do the act. The words "any part of" mean "all or part of" and "in whole or in part". The word "includes" means "includes but is not limited to". The word "deemed" is used when a legal fiction, or what may in some cases be a legal fiction, is intended. The word "is" is used for statements of fact and legal conclusions. When a right is conferred, the words "is entitled" or their equivalent are used. The words "under section ____" are used instead of "pursuant to section ____" and "in accordance with section ____". The word "such" is used as a demonstrative adjective only in the rare case when it improves clarity. The use of the word "each", "any", "every", or "all" is confined to instances in which a doubt could arise if the word were not used. The singular form of a noun is used to convey the plural form of that noun as well, and the plural form conveys the singular. Provisos are not used. An exception or limitation is introduced by the words

"except that" or "but" or by placing the excepting or limiting provision in a separate sentence. The words "committee of Congress" include a committee of either House of Congress, a joint committee of Congress, or a subcommittee of any of those committees.

Section 4—Conforming Amendments to Other Laws

Section 4 of the bill makes conforming amendments to laws other than those restated in the new title 6 or repealed.

Section 4(1)(2) amends title 49, United States Code (Transportation), to insert into chapter 51 (Transportation of Hazardous Material) sections 1553 and 1555 of the Homeland Security Act (6 U.S.C. 1203 and 1205). Those sections are administered by the Secretary of Transportation and involve highway routing of hazardous material and security inspections. Because these involve duties of the Secretary of Transportation, they are restated in title 49 rather than the new title 6.
