# H. R. 2882

To amend the Small Business Act and title 38, United States Code to provide for a consolidated definition of a small business concern owned and controlled by veterans, and for other purposes.

Mr. COFFMAN (for himself, Mr. GRAVES of Missouri, Mr. MILLER of Florida, Mr. FLORES, Mr. HANNA, and Mr. CONNOLLY) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Small Business, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

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## A BILL

To amend the Small Business Act and title 38, United States Code to provide for a consolidated definition of a small business concern owned and controlled by veterans, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2       tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Improving Opportuni-  
5       ties for Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Businesses  
6       Act of 2013”.

1   **SEC. 2. SMALL BUSINESS DEFINITION OF SMALL BUSINESS**

2                   **CONCERN CONSOLIDATED.**

3       Section 3(q) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.

4 632(q)) is amended—

5                   (1) in paragraph (2), to read as follows:

6                   “(2) SMALL BUSINESS CONCERN OWNED AND

7                   CONTROLLED BY SERVICE-DISABLED VETERANS.—

8       The term ‘small business concern owned and con-

9                   trolled by service-disabled veterans’ means a small

10                  business concern—

11                   “(A)(i) not less than 51 percent of which

12                  is owned by one or more service-disabled vet-

13                  erans or, in the case of any publicly owned busi-

14                  ness, not less than 51 percent of the stock of

15                  which is owned by one or more service-disabled

16                  veterans; and

17                   “(ii) the management and daily business

18                  operations of which are controlled by one or

19                  more service-disabled veterans or, in the case of

20                  a veteran with permanent and severe disability,

21                  the spouse or permanent caregiver of such vet-

22                  eran; or

23                   “(B) not less than 51 percent of which is

24                  owned by one or more veterans with service-

25                  connected disabilities that are permanent and

26                  total who are unable to manage the daily busi-

1           ness operations of such concern or, in the case  
2           of a publicly owned business, not less than 51  
3           percent of the stock of which is owned by one  
4           or more such veterans.”; and

5           (2) by adding at the end the following:

6           “(6) TREATMENT OF BUSINESSES AFTER  
7           DEATH OF VETERAN-OWNER.—

8           “(A) IN GENERAL.—Subject to subparagraph  
9           (C), if the death of a service-disabled vet-  
10          eran causes a small business concern to be less  
11          than 51 percent owned by one or more such  
12          veterans, the surviving spouse of such veteran  
13          who acquires ownership rights in such small  
14          business concern shall, for the period described  
15          in subparagraph (B), be treated as if the sur-  
16          viving spouse were that veteran for the purpose  
17          of maintaining the status of the small business  
18          concern as a small business concern owned and  
19          controlled by service-disabled veterans.

20           “(B) PERIOD DESCRIBED.—The period re-  
21          ferred to in subparagraph (A) is the period be-  
22          ginning on the date on which the service-dis-  
23          abled veteran dies and ending on the earliest of  
24          the following dates:

1                         “(i) The date on which the surviving  
2                         spouse remarries.

3                         “(ii) The date on which the surviving  
4                         spouse relinquishes an ownership interest  
5                         in the small business concern.

6                         “(iii) The date that is ten years after  
7                         the date of the veteran’s death.

8                         “(C) APPLICATION TO SURVIVING  
9                         SPOUSE.—Subparagraph (A) only applies to a  
10                         surviving spouse of a veteran with a service-con-  
11                         nected disability rated as 100 percent disabling  
12                         or who dies as a result of a service-connected  
13                         disability.”.

14 **SEC. 3. VETERANS AFFAIRS DEFINITION OF SMALL BUSI-  
15                         NESS CONCERN CONSOLIDATED.**

16                         Section 8127 of title 38, United States Code, is  
17                         amended—

18                         (1) by striking subsection (h); and  
19                         (2) in subsection (l)(2), by striking “means”  
20                         and all that follows through the period at the end  
21                         and inserting the following: “has the meaning given  
22                         that term under section 3(q) of the Small Business  
23                         Act (15 U.S.C. 632(q)).”.

1   **SEC. 4. SBA TO ASSUME CONTROL OF VERIFICATION OF**  
2                 **OWNERSHIP AND CONTROL STATUS OF AP-**  
3                 **PLICANTS FOR INCLUSION IN THE DATABASE**  
4                 **OF SMALL BUSINESSES OWNED AND CON-**  
5                 **TROLLED BY SERVICE DISABLED VETERANS**  
6                 **AND VETERANS.**

7         The Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 631 et seq.) is  
8         amended by adding at the end the following:

9         **“SEC. 47. VETS FIRST PROGRAM.**

10         “Not later than 180 days after the effective date of  
11         this section, the Administrator shall enter into a memo-  
12         randum of understanding with the Secretary of Veterans  
13         Affairs that transfer control and administration of the  
14         program under subsections (e) through (g) of section 8127  
15         of title 38, United States Code, to the Administrator, con-  
16         sistent with the following:

17                 “(1) Not later than 270 days after completing  
18         the memorandum of understanding, the Adminis-  
19         trator shall make rules to carry out the memo-  
20         randum. If the Administrator does not make such  
21         rules by such date, the Administrator may not exer-  
22         cise the authority under section 7(a)(25)(A) until  
23         such time as those rules are made.

24                 “(2) The Administrator shall assume authority  
25         and responsibility for maintenance and operation of

1       the database and for verifications under the pro-  
2       gram.

3           “(3) Any appeal by a small business concern, at  
4       the time that verification is denied or a contract is  
5       awarded, of any determination under the program  
6       shall be heard by the Office of Hearings and Ap-  
7       peals of the Small Business Administration.

8           “(4) The Secretary shall, for a period of 6  
9       years commencing on a date agreed to in the com-  
10      pleted memorandum, reimburse to the Administrator  
11      of the Small Business Administration any costs in-  
12      curred by the Administrator for actions undertaken  
13      pursuant to the memorandum from fees collected by  
14      the Secretary of Veteran Affairs under multiple-  
15      award schedule contracts. Any disputes between the  
16      Secretary and the Administrator shall be resolved by  
17      the Director of the Office of Management and Budg-  
18      et”.

19 **SEC. 5. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING.**

20       Section 8127(f) of title 38, United States Code, is  
21      amended by adding at the end the following:

22           “(7) Not later than 180 days after the effective  
23      date of this paragraph, the Secretary shall enter into  
24      a memorandum of understanding with the Adminis-

1 trator of the Small Business Administration con-  
2 sistent with section 47 of the Small Business Act.”.
