








Federal Deficit/Surplus in 2024 (in Billions of Dollars)





DEFENSE SPENDING IS A DECLINING SHARE OF FEDERAL SPENDING









U.S. Debt Held by Public as a Share of the Economy





Government Spending as a Share of the Economy






