I am writing to strongly encourage your support of H.R. 2273, "The Combustion Residuals Re-use and Management Act, which passed out of House committee with bipartisan support and for the Shimkus Manager's Amendment to H.R. 2273, which makes certain improvements to the committee-passed bill. This bill addresses a long-standing issue with respect to how states should address the management of Coal Combustion Residuals (CCRs) in an environmentally protective manner. The bill provides for state regulation of CCRs with a uniform baseline of national standards and provides for appropriate EPA oversight. This bill will minimize some of the administrative burden on already strained state and federal resources.

Both the Environmental Council of States (ECOS) and the Association of State and Territorial Solid Waste Management Officials (ASTSWMO), which represent the bipartisan state environmental leaders, are fully supportive of H.R. 2273 and the Shimkus Manager's Amendment.

The bill's approach ensures that states will regulate CCRs under federal standards with a maximum of flexibility, preservation of the rights of states to be more stringent, and in a manner which will assure the quickest implementation. The proposal outlined in H.R.2273 addresses CCRs management concerns by using a combination of existing state and federal regulations. It would establish an enforceable federal baseline for the regulation of CCRs to which all states must adhere. The legislation would accomplish this without having EPA establish additional federal regulations, but instead places that responsibility on the states to conform to these new federal requirements. This bill is a logical, protective approach to managing CCRs without the negative impacts that will result from the EPA's proposed rule.

It is my understanding that the full House of Representatives is scheduled to consider H.R. 2273 and the Shimkus Manager's Amendment on Friday, October 14, 2011.
