

H R 469, a bill to encourage research, development and demonstration of technologies to facilitate the utilization of water produced in connection with the development of domestic energy resources and for other purposes, introduced by Mr. Hall (R-TX).

**January 14, 2009** H R 500, a bill to establish a collaborative program to protect the Great Lakes and for other purposes, introduced by Mr. Ehlers (R-MI).

**January 15, 2009** H R 554, a bill to authorize activities for support of nanotechnology research and development and for other purposes, introduced by Mr. Gordon (D-TN).
