ACTIVITIES OF THE COMMITTEE ON SMALL BUSINESS 111TH CONGRESS, 1st Session

SEPTEMBER 2009 FULL COMMITTEE HEARINGS & MARK-UPS

09-09-09: "THE CHALLENGES OF THE 2009-H1N1 INFLUENZA AND ITS POTENTIAL IMPACT ON SMALL BUSINESSES AND HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS"

The Committee evaluated how the federal government is preparing small firms and health providers to ensure any negative economic impact is minimized. The Committee received testimony on how the 2009-H1N1 Influenza has affected the small business economy.

09-23-09: "THE IMPACT OF FINANCIAL REGULATORY RESTRUCTURING ON SMALL BUSINESSES AND COMMUNITY LENDERS"

This hearing examined how proposed changes to the structure and powers of federal financial services regulators will affect smaller firms.

09-30-09: "EXPIRING TAX INCENTIVES: EXAMINING THEIR IMPORTANCE FOR SMALL BUSINESSES ON THE ROAD TO AN ECONOMIC RECOVERY"

The hearing focused on the numerous tax provisions that small businesses utilize to grow and expand their business which are set to expire at the end of 2009. As Congress considers policies that will sustain the economic recovery witnessed in the past few months, the Committee examined the importance of a variety of these tax incentives and their impact on small firms.

09-16-09: "THE ROLE OF AUTOMOBILE DEALERSHIPS IN RURAL ECONOMIES" The Rural Development, Entrepreneurship and Trade Subcommittee examined the effect of automobile dealers on local communities.

09-24-09: "THE ROLES OF FEDERAL LABS IN SPURRING INNOVATION AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP ACROSS THE U.S."

The Contracting and Technology Subcommittee reviewed the importance of research projects in job creation as Congress considers ways to promote entrepreneurship and innovation. The Subcommittee heard testimony from industry representatives on how small businesses performing contracts for federal labs and research facilities have generated technological advancements and local economic benefits.
