USCC 2014 REPORT TO CONGRESS Report Release Date: November 20th

Washington, D.C. - The U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission will release its 2014 Report to Congress on **Thursday, November 20, 2014, at 9:30 am at a public event in room 2118 of the Rayburn House Office Building.**

This year's report covers the key U.S.-China economic and trade issues, security developments in the U.S.-China relationship, and China's diplomatic efforts in the Asia-Pacific region and beyond. The report also examines U.S.-China clean energy cooperation, China's growing healthcare industry, and the safety of Chinese drug imports to the United States. In addition, the report investigates the East Asian regional balance of power, China's ongoing military modernization, and Chinese domestic stability. China's bilateral relationships are also covered, including China's relationships with North Korea and Taiwan. The report concludes with an examination of the ongoing unrest in Hong Kong.

At the release event, Commission Chairman, Dennis Shea, and Vice Chairman, William Reinsch, will discuss the Commission's findings and recommendations and answer questions from the audience.
