Dear Representative Barber,

On behalf of the Association of the United States Navy (AUSN) we applaud and support your bill, H.R. 4574, the Strengthening Mental Health in Our Communities Act of 2014, which would maximize the access of individuals with mental illness to community-based services, to strengthen the impact of such services.

Our nation must renew our commitment to mental health and improving the lives of individuals and families impacted by mental illness. Alarmingly, according to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP), over 20 percent of suicides in the United States every year are military Veterans. Vital programs to help treat mental health need to be strengthened. For instance, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) needs reauthorization for many critical programs for community-based mental health services.

H.R. 4574 would, amongst other things, create a White House Office for Mental Health Policy that is responsible for developing and implementing a national strategy to combat mental health; bolster mental health for Veterans and Active Duty servicemembers; establish a Mental Health Advisory Board of individuals with mental illness, parents and guardians of individuals with mental illness, mental health professionals, and others; strengthen and invest in SAMHSA programs; provide access to quality mental healthcare in communities nationwide and enhance mental health research and coordination
