#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Fiscal Responsibility

5 and Retirement Security Act of 2011".

### 6 SEC. 2. REPEAL OF CLASS PROGRAM.

7 (a) REPEAL.—Title XXXII of the Public Health
8 Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300ll et seq.; relating to the
9 CLASS program) is repealed.

1	(b) Conforming Changes.—
2	(1) Title VIII of the Patient Protection and Af-
3	fordable Care Act (Public Law 111–148; 124 Stat.
4	119, 846–847) is repealed.
5	(2) Section 1902(a) of the Social Security Act
6	(42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)) is amended—
7	(A) by striking paragraphs (81) and (82);
8	(B) in paragraph (80), by inserting "and"
9	at the end; and
10	(C) by redesignating paragraph (83) as
11	paragraph (81).
12	(3) Paragraphs (2) and (3) of section $6021(d)$
13	of the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 (42 U.S.C.
14	1396p note) are amended to read as such para-
15	graphs were in effect on the day before the date of
16	the enactment of section 8002(d) of the Patient Pro-
17	tection and Affordable Care Act (Public Law 111–
18	148). Of the funds appropriated by paragraph (3) of
19	such section $6021(d)$ , as amended by the Patient
20	Protection and Affordable Care Act, the unobligated
21	balance is rescinded.
