Dear President Bush:

We are compelled to write you, many of us for the third time, regarding your position on access to birth control. On July 12, 2005 and August 1, 2005, nineteen Members of Congress sent you two letters asking you to clarify your position on access to birth control. Unfortunately, we have not received a response.

Additionally, at a May 26, 2005 press briefing, Scott McClellan refused to "dignify" a reporter's question about your stance on birth control with an answer. Again on July 18, 2005, McClellan was asked by the same reporter about your stance on birth control, and once more he would not provide a direct answer. Four times in four months, Members of Congress, the press, and the American people have been denied your position on access to birth control.

It is important that we know where you stand on access to birth control; 95% of American women use birth control at some point in their lives, but for the first time in decades access to birth control is in doubt:

- Sen. Rick Santorum, a top Senate leader in your party, has proclaimed that birth control is "harmful to women and harmful to society;"
- Across the country, there is a growing movement of pharmacists refusing to fill women's prescriptions for birth control pills;
- You appointed to the FDA's Reproductive Health Drugs Advisory Committee Dr. W. David Hager, a controversial doctor who reportedly refused to write birth-control prescriptions for unmarried women;
- Harriet Miers, your nominee to the Supreme Court, has not yet decided if access to birth control is protected by the Constitution, stating that she "is not ready to give an answer" on whether *Griswold v. Connecticut* is "settled law."

Because of all this, we have one simple: Mr. President, are you for or against birth control?
