I Will Continue Fighting

On Wednesday, my major jobs and conservation legislation, the Southeast

Arizona Land Exchange and Conservation Act, was placed on the calendar but not voted on. This setback will not discourage me from my continued fight for this important Arizona jobs bill.

The Southeast Arizona Land Exchange and Conservation Act authorizes a federal land exchange that will open the third largest undeveloped copper resource in the world, located near Superior, Arizona. In exchange, more than 5,000 acres of high-value Arizona conservation lands will be protected. The mine would create more than 3,700 local jobs, generate more than \$61.4 billion in economic activity and could supply 25 percent or more of the nation's domestic copper demand. Arizona Deserves a Refund

Wednesday I joined Sens. John McCain and Jeff Flake and Reps. Kyrsten Sinema, Ann Kirkpatrick, Trent Franks, Ron Barber, David Schweikert, and Matt Salmon in signing a letter to Director Jon Jarvis of the National Park Service requesting the \$465,000 that Arizona paid to reopen Grand Canyon National Park during the recent government shutdown be fully refunded. During the government shutdown of 1995, Arizona provided \$370,125 to keep the Park open. The National Park Service eventually repaid Arizona for that expense. We expect no less this time.
