Dear Chairmen Shuster and Boxer and Ranking Members Rahall and Vitter:

On behalf of the owners and operators of the 57 large, United States-flag, self-propelled vessels and tug/barge units moving dry-bulk cargos on the Great Lakes and supporting the Midwest economy, the Lake Carriers Association (LCA) is very pleased to support House and Senate passage of the conference report on H.R. 3080, the Water Resources Reform and Development Act of 2014 (WRRDA 2014) and urge its immediate enactment into law. This comprehensive legislation includes a number of provisions that will improve the efficiency and reliability of vessel navigation on America's fourth seacoast, the Great Lakes.

We are pleased with the conference report's inclusion of increased target levels for spending Harbor Maintenance Trust Fund (HMTF) revenues, direction to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to manage the harbors and waterways of the Great Lakes as a single, interdependent system, definition of, and funding for, the Great Lakes Navigation System, and increased emphasis on regional economic importance and decreased emphasis on annual port tonnage as factors for prioritizing annual harbor maintenance funding.

LCA will continue to work with other inland and coastal navigation stakeholders, your Committees, and other Members of Congress to fully fund federal harbor maintenance and strengthen the WRRDA 2014 provisions regarding HMTF spending and the Great Lakes. Thank you again for your leadership in producing this bill and providing momentum for future WRRDA bills.
