

Dr. Ginger Zhe Jin, Professor of Economics, University of Maryland

Dr. Ginger Zhe Jin is a professor of empirical industrial organization and applied econometrics at the University of Maryland. Her primary fields of research are industrial organization, health economics, and the economics of family. Most of her research focuses on information asymmetry among economic agents and how to provide information to overcome the information problem. The applications she has studied include restaurant hygiene report cards in Los Angeles, rating of health care organizations, advertising and learning of prescription drugs, online trading, and the intra-familial interaction between parents and children.

Her research has been published in the *Quarterly Journal of Economics*, *Review of Economic Studies*, *Economic Journal*, *RAND Journal of Economics*, the *Journal of Health Economics* and *Quantitative Marketing and Economics*. Her research has been supported by the National Science Foundation, the Net Institute, and the Sloan Foundation. Currently, she is working on peer-to-peer lending, research misconduct, inspector behavior in regulatory enforcement, and several projects related to China's economic development, health insurance, and air quality. She is a Research Associate of the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER) and a co-editor of the *Journal of Economics & Management Strategy*. She received her PhD from the University of California Los Angeles in 2000.
