She was also the editor of "China's Capacity to Manage Infectious Diseases" (April 2009). She has authored articles on nontraditional security threats in China's environment and health sectors in the *South China Morning Post*, the *China Environment Series*, published by the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars, and *Global AIDSLink*, published by the Global Health Council.

Ms. Boynton holds an M.A. in sustainable international development from Brandeis University and a B.A. in international economics and trade from Beijing Second Foreign Language University.
