Final Report on the Quality Assessment Review of the Re: Investigative Operations of the Office of Inspector General for the Architect of the Capitol (AOC OlG)

Dear Ms. Bates:

We reviewed the system of internal safeguards and management procedures for the AOC OIG Office of Investigations in effect for the period ending April 26, 2013. Our review was conducted in conformity with the Quality Standards for Investigations and the Quality Assessment Review Guidelines established by the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE), and the Attorney General's Guidelines for Office of Inspectors General with Statutory Law Enforcement Authority, as applicable.

We reviewed compliance with your organization's system of internal policies and procedures to the extent we considered appropriate. The review was conducted at your organization's sole Office of Investigations location in Washington, D.C. We interviewed all Office of Investigations personnel regarding their independent knowledge of internal policies and procedures, as well as investigative guidelines established by CIGIE and the Attorney General. Finally, we reviewed key programmatic areas, such as your evidence, weapons, and training programs, and sampled 23 case files for investigations closed during fiscal years 2012 and 2013 (Attachments 1 and 2).

In performing our review, we have given appropriate consideration to the Inspector General Act of 1978 (Public Law 95-452), as amended, Section 812 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (Public Law 107-296), the Architect of the Capitol Inspector General Act of 2007 (Public Law 110-161), and the

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applicable Attorney General guidelines. These documents articulate the specific authorities, roles, responsibilities, and requirements of your office as whole and, specifically in this instance, your Office of Investigations.

In our opinion, the system of internal safeguards and management procedures for the AOC OIG Office of Investigations in effect as of April 26, 2013, is **Compliant** with the quality standards established by the CIGIE and the applicable Attorney General guidelines. These safeguards and procedures provide reasonable assurance of conforming with professional standards in the planning, execution and reporting of its investigations.

On June 12, 2013, we received your response, dated June 4, 2013, to our Draft Quality Assessment Review Report in which you concurred with our assessment (Attachment 3). Consequently, our review team will take no further action and we consider this matter closed.

In closing, I would like to commend your entire Office of Investigations staff for their full cooperation and professionalism that they afforded to my team during this entire review process. Undoubtedly, you have a talented cadre of investigators that have and will continue to make positive contributions to your organization's mission and that of the AOC overall.
