Washington, DC – Today, Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell released the following statement in response to the passing of memoirist and poet, Maya Angelou:

“Today, we lost one of the most renowned and inspirational voices of our time. Through her work, Dr. Maya Angelou recorded and celebrated the tragedies and triumphs of the African American experience and provided a voice to women across the world suffering from sexual abuse and discrimination. From overcoming poverty and first-hand racial segregation in the Jim Crow South during her youth to becoming one of our country’s most cherished poets, Dr. Angelou has inspired generations to overcome the confines of their circumstances.

Although Dr. Angelou has left us, her words will continue to be a guide, empowering and comforting us during times of grief and success. Today, as we continue to fight modern-day barriers to voting rights and efforts to strip women of the ability to make personal choices, I am inspired and empowered by the eloquent words Dr. Angelou spoke at the inauguration of President Bill Clinton in January 1993:

“History, despite its wrenching pain,

Cannot be unlived, and if faced

With courage, need not be lived again”

Through our grief, may we draw strength from the resolute power of Dr. Angelou’s words and live out her mission to “not merely survive, but to thrive; and to do so with some passion, some compassion, some humor, and some style.”

CONGRESSWOMAN SEWELL SUPPORTS LEGISLATION TO IMPROVE AND STRENGTHEN HOUSING FINANCING OPTIONS FOR RURAL AMERICANS

Washington, DC – Today, Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell issued the following statement after voting in favor of the Preserving Access to Manufactured Housing Act to be reported out of committee for passage on the house floor:

“Today, I voted in favor of the Preserving Access to Manufactured Housing Act to be reported out of the Financial Services Committee for passage on the house floor. I strongly believe that low-income, rural Americans should have access to the financing needed to purchase affordable housing. This legislation ensures that manufactured housing remains a viable and affordable option.

While this is not a perfect bill, I have made a commitment to working with my Democratic and Republican Colleagues, including Ranking Member Maxine Waters (D-CA) and Rep. Stephen Fincher (R-TN), to ensure that the maximum allowable interest rate to finance the purchase of a manufactured home is reasonable and fair. I look forward to strengthening this bill and improving accessibility to affordable housing for rural Americans, in the State of Alabama and across the country.”

USDA Celebrates Homeownership Month

Agency Assists Record Number of Rural Families to Become Homeowners in 2013; Efforts underway to boost loan guarantee, refinancing opportunities

WASHINGTON, May 30, 2014 – Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack today kicked-off National Homeownership Month by highlighting USDA's record delivery of single-family housing assistance to rural families and encouraging rural residents to purchase or refinance homes in rural areas.

"Since the start of USDA's single-family housing programs in 1949, USDA employees have helped nearly 3.4 million rural residents buy homes of their own," Vilsack said. "Many of these are lower-income, first-time homebuyers who are earning a leg up into the middle class. Homeownership is a critical step on the ladder of opportunity as it helps build equity and increase assets. Simply put, homeownership means long-term financial stability and security for these rural families."

The Obama Administration housing's policies are helping to strengthen rural communities and the overall rural economy. In 2013 alone, USDA helped more than 170,000 rural residents become homeowners, investing more than \$23.4 billion in loans, grants and technical assistance to provide affordable, safe housing for rural families. In both people served and dollars, 2013 was the most successful year in the history of USDA single-family housing programs.

USDA Rural Development programs that support rural homeownership include:

- [Direct home loans](#) for very-low-income applicants. Payment assistance is provided that can lower the loan's interest rate to as low as one percent.
- [Guaranteed home loans](#) for moderate-income families. The agency works in partnership with private-sector lenders to back the lenders' loans.
- [Home repair loans and grants](#) to help rural homeowners make improvements or repairs. Examples include making homes accessible for people with disabilities or removing health and safety hazards like poor wiring or plumbing.

In 2012, as part of President Obama's ongoing efforts to help middle-class families, USDA launched a [rural refinance pilot program](#) in states hardest hit by the housing downturn. The program lets people with USDA direct or guaranteed home loans refinance in order to take advantage of lower interest rates and lower their monthly mortgage payments. In January 2013, [15 more states and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico](#) were added to the pilot.

USDA is making changes to the guaranteed home loan program to help create jobs, enable more people to participate, spur new home construction and inject more capital into rural areas. The changes will increase the availability of housing loans in underserved communities, such as those

targeted by USDA's [StrikeForce initiative](#) to help alleviate rural poverty.

The changes take effect on September 1, 2014, and include:

- **Increased lender eligibility.** Many small community banks and credit unions, which are currently ineligible, will be able to participate.
- **Construction-to-permanent financing.** Currently, only "take-out" financing is permitted once construction is complete. "Construction-to-perm" financing — also called "single close" financing — will provide funds when construction begins. This will encourage homebuilders, lenders and borrowers to build more new homes.

Here is the story of a couple who benefitted from a USDA loan: Donald and Priscilla Brooks of Lake Charles, La., became proud first-time homeowners. They were struggling to make ends meet because of high rent, but worked with a local USDA housing specialist to apply for a direct home loan. They were approved in August 2012. Today, even with property taxes and insurance, their monthly housing expenses are less than what they had been paying to rent.

USDA OFFERS LOAN, GRANTS TO SUPPORT RURAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack announced that the Department is accepting applications for loans and grants to support community development projects, business expansion and job creation.

“These USDA investments are part of the Obama Administration’s ongoing efforts to create jobs and expand economic opportunities for rural entrepreneurs,” Vilsack said. “Through them, USDA is working with local organizations to provide capital to help small business owners achieve their goals. These investments are helping rural residents take the next steps on the ladder to greater success and opportunity.”

Assistance is being provided through two USDA Rural Development programs: the **Intermediary Relending Program (IRP)** and the **Rural Microentrepreneur Assistance Program (RMAP)**. The 2014 Farm Bill reauthorized both programs through 2018. For Fiscal Year 2014, \$18.9 million in IRP loans are available, and \$25.4 million in RMAP loans and grants are available.

Under IRP, USDA lends money to economic development intermediaries (non-profits and public bodies) who re-lend it to rural businesses (ultimate recipients) that might not otherwise be able to obtain such financing. The program supports sustainable economic development and helps create or retain jobs in disadvantaged and remote communities. USDA encourages intermediaries to work with state and regional representatives and with other public and private organizations that can provide complementary resources. Since President Obama took office, the IRP program has created or saved an estimated 92,000 jobs.

Under RMAP, USDA provides loans and grants to Microenterprise Development Organizations (MDOs) to help microentrepreneurs — very small businesses with 10 or fewer employees — access microloans to start or develop businesses. MDOs use the funds to provide training and technical assistance to eligible small businesses or to establish revolving loan funds to provide micro-loans, typically \$5,000 to \$50,000, to rural microentrepreneurs. Since the beginning of the Obama Administration, the RMAP program has provided \$52 million for 257 projects to support very small business enterprises.

Details about how to apply for 2014 IRP funding are on **page 28886** and for 2014 RMAP funding are on **page 28888** of today's *Federal Register*. Application forms may be obtained from any USDA Rural Development **State Office**.

The Mid-Columbia Economic Development District in Maupin, Ore., used a \$100,000 IRP loan and other funding to keep Maupin's local grocery store open and save six jobs. The new owner used the funds to remodel the 90-year-old establishment, which serves residents and tourists and is the only grocery store within 40 miles.

USDA provided \$605,000 in RMAP loans and grants to California FarmLink, a statewide non-profit serving limited-resource, underserved farmers. FarmLink used the funds to provide 23 micro-loans and technical assistance to small farmers in California. The farmers bought seeds, plants and equipment, hired workers, marketed their crops and became more profitable. More than half of the micro-loans were provided to women and minority farmers.

USDA SEEKS APPLICATIONS TO FINANCE CONSTRUCTION AND REHABILITATION OF RURAL RENTAL HOUSING

Washington, D.C., May 21, 2014 -- Agriculture Deputy Under Secretary Doug O'Brien today announced that USDA is seeking applications from eligible lenders for loan guarantees to finance the construction or rehabilitation of rural rental housing.

"Working to ensure that individuals and families in rural areas have safe, decent and affordable housing is a major part of USDA Rural Development's mission," O'Brien said. "USDA's housing programs make a real difference in the lives of thousands of rural Americans nationwide by helping them obtain housing opportunities that they might not otherwise have. Revitalizing rural rental housing helps create construction jobs and maintain safe and stable rural communities."

USDA is seeking proposals from lenders for loans under the Guaranteed Rural Rental Housing Program. The Department plans to make up to \$150 million available. Approved applications from prior years' notices will be the first to receive funding.

Loan guarantees are available to construct, acquire and rehabilitate affordable rural rental housing. USDA will review responses submitted by eligible lenders, on the lender's letterhead, and signed by both the prospective borrower and lender. Although a complete application is not required in response to this notice, eligible lenders may submit a complete application with a response.

The response deadline is December 31, 2015. Details are on page 29159 of today's [*Federal Register*](#). Selected responses that develop into complete applications will normally be funded with the fiscal year funds available on the date the application is completed.

This program continues its successful record of providing affordable rural rental housing. When the community of River Falls, Wis., realized there was a shortage in quality, affordable rental housing for area seniors, it turned to USDA Rural Development. In response, the Agency approved a loan guaranteed through First National Bank of River Falls to construct a 24-unit facility for residents age 55 and older. The complex, Windmill Place, has been an overwhelming success and is a great asset within the River Falls community.

Since 2009, USDA has provided new or rehabbed rental homes to 16,000 families through the Guaranteed Rural Rental Housing Program.

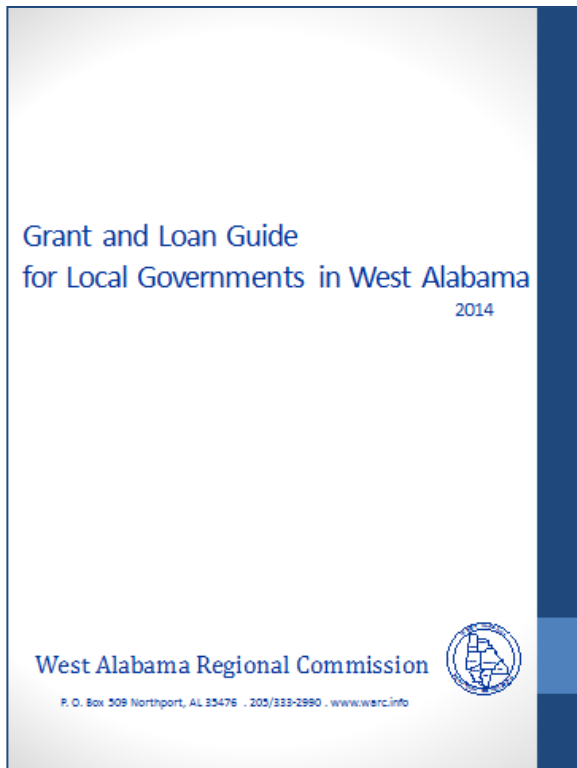

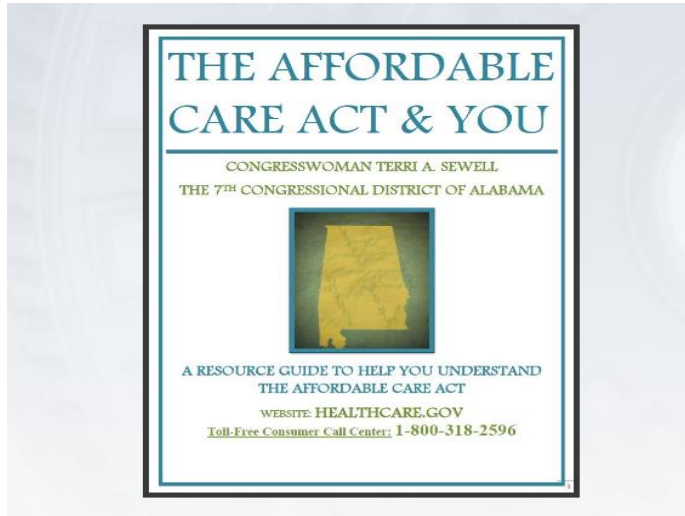
