- KPAP is the Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC) in Kentucky

 - Automatically matches a company's products and services against a database of federal, state, and local government bid opportunities
 - Collect bid information from several thousand government buying offices nationwide
 - Summary notices of government contracting opportunities are e-mailed to participating firms
 - No cost to KPAP clients

SB45 - New Commonwealth Law

- A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 45A IS CREATED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
- (1) Prior to a contract being awarded to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder on a contract by a public agency, a resident bidder of the Commonwealth shall be given a preference against a nonresident bidder registered in any state that gives or requires a preference to bidders from that state. The preference shall be equal to the preference given or required by the state of the nonresident bidder.

- 5. Special Categories
- Generally, The Federal Spending Goal is 23% of Contracts Awarded to Small Businesses:
 - 7% Any small business
 - 5% Small disadvantaged business
 - 5% Women-owned small business
 - 3% Service disabled veteran owned small business
 - 3% Hubzone certified








Historically Underutilized Business Zone



 - Offer Not SIGNED (or not signed in ink)
 - Bid Package in Wrong Format
