***Who May Submit Proposals:** Proposals may only be submitted by the following: - Academic / Research Institutions; includes universities and two- and four-year colleges (including community colleges) accredited in, and having a campus located in, the US acting on behalf of their faculty members. Includes non-profit academic / research institutions. ***Who May Serve as PI: Lineage Requirement:** The Principal Investigator (PI) or a co-PI must have had an NSF award that ended no more than 6-years prior to the chosen submission window's full proposal deadline date or be a current NSF award recipient. The proposed proof-of-concept or prototype/ scale-up must be derived from the research results and/or discoveries from this underlying NSF award. Note: a proposal describing sole lineage to any of the following programs is not allowed and may be returned without review: Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REU), Research Experiences for Teachers (RET), the Graduate Research Fellowship Program (GRFP), PFI: AIR-TT, PFI: AIR-RA, I-CorpsTM, and SBIR/STTR. The PI must be a faculty member at a U.S. academic / research institution at the time of the award. In addition to the PI, there must be at least one other participant on the project (e.g., someone listed as a co-PI, Senior Personnel, Other Professional, subawardee, consultant, collaborator, etc.) with explicit business experience (for example, someone from the technology transfer office, the business school, a local/regional development office, a business entity, etc.). Additional Information on Eligibility: Applicants are limited to national associations, private nonprofit organizations (including tribal nonprofit organizations), faith- and community-based organizations, institutions of higher education (including tribal institutions of higher education), and public agencies (including federally recognized Indian tribal governments as determined by the Secretary of the Interior) that can demonstrate knowledge and understanding of state-administered VOCA assistance and compensations programs, and that possess the staff, resources, and capability to plan and implement a national training conference for approximately 250 VOCA

administrators and their staff. OVC welcomes applications that involve two or more entities; however, one eligible entity must be the applicant and the others must be proposed as subrecipients. Description: Progress on public health goals of immunization will depend on a higher standard of collaboration among pharmacists and other health care providers. The purpose of this FOA is to demonstrate successful models of collaboration between pharmacists and other healthcare providers in a way that ensures up-to-date vaccination status of their shared patients. Stalled progress in raising some categories of immunization rates could be overcome if pharmacists and other healthcare providers could achieve a higher level of "immunization collaboration." Better collaboration between pharmacists and other healthcare providers is needed because of the increasing interdependence of pharmacists and other clinicians. Pharmacists are providing a higher percentage of immunization than in previous years. With that comes the need to strengthen their collaboration with other healthcare providers. Stronger immunization collaboration would be characterized by the following: Primary care providers are efficiently informed of vaccination provided by pharmacists. Both pharmacists and other healthcare providers use immunization information systems (IIS) for assessing vaccination status. Every vaccination is recorded in state-based immunization information systems. Consumers have easier access to their immunization records. Better systems are developed for managing, tracking and reporting adverse events. Includes improved use of VAERS as the routine procedure in the case of adverse events. Innovative effective approaches are developed that demonstrate stronger immunization collaboration among pharmacists and other healthcare providers. Ongoing quality improvement efforts identify and address missed opportunities. Successful models of immunization collaboration demonstrate how to identify missed opportunities and take actions to vaccinate. Dissemination and outreach to a national audience of healthcare providers spark immunization collaboration in their communities. Preparedness is ensured, in case of future disease outbreaks. Three challenges in immunization will be supported when a greater degree of immunization collaboration is in place, linking pharmacists and other healthcare providers. These three important public health challenges are: To achieve series completion of three-dose

recommendation for HPV vaccination. To ensure adult patients are up-to-date on the full array of recommended vaccines. To ensure pharmacies are engaged with public health programs in the area of pandemic vaccine preparedness. This FOA seeks models that demonstrate successful approaches for ensuring patients are up-to-date on recommended immunizations. Measures that demonstrate HPV vaccination series completion, better pandemic vaccine preparedness and increased adult vaccination rates are the desired long-term outcomes. In the first phase of the project, efforts will focus on implementing successful models of collaboration in the clinic setting on a local or regional level. In the second phase of the project, efforts will focus on implementing successful models of collaboration on a national level. The application should propose a local-level plan to occur in a clinical setting with adolescent and adult patients, as well as a national plan. Applicant organizations must demonstrate a significant and active membership of pharmacists, as outlined in the Organizational Capacity section of the FOA. Applications should describe a technical package of activities designed to ensure up-to-date vaccination status among a group of patients shared by pharmacists and other healthcare providers. The technical package of activities should rely on evidence-based strategies, but may propose innovative approaches for selecting, combining or implementing strategies. Project activities will likely be described in these categories, but other categories may be proposed: Provider Education/Outreach Changes in Patient Care Procedures Quality Improvement Efforts Pandemic Preparedness Activities Improved Immunization Documentation and Data Sharing On the clinical practice level: Evidence-based interventions have been described in the Community Guide of the Preventive Services Task Force. These include reminder-recall, standing orders, use of immunization information systems. On the national level, strategies to achieve changes in provider behavior or knowledge are still being developed, so impactful successful approaches are needed.
