SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1008

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

MAKING APPLICATION TO THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO CALL A CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION TO PROPOSE AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES TO PROVIDE THE PRESIDENT WITH AN ITEM VETO IN APPROPRIATION BILLS.

1           Whereas, the people of the State of Arizona view with growing concern  
2 the passage of extravagant legislation by Congress and the inability of the  
3 President to separate such legislation from an otherwise worthwhile bill.  
4 Therefore  
5 Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Arizona, the House of  
6 Representatives concurring, that:  
7           1. The Legislature of this state applies to the Congress of the  
8 United States to call a convention for the sole and exclusive purpose of  
9 deliberating, drafting and proposing an amendment to the Constitution of  
10 the United States to authorize the President of the United States to  
11 disapprove and veto any appropriation or provision of an appropriation  
12 bill while approving the remainder of the bill, which amendment, pursuant  
13 to Article V of the United States Constitution, would then have to be  
14 ratified by three-fourths of the states to take effect.  
15           2. This application constitutes a continuing application for a  
16 convention pursuant to Article V of the Constitution of the United States  
17 until the Legislatures of two-thirds of the states have made like  
18 applications and the convention has been called by the Congress of the  
19 United States.  
20           3. The Secretary of State of the State of Arizona is requested to  
21 transmit certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution to the President  
22 of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of  
23 Representatives, to each Member of the Arizona Congressional Delegation  
24 and to the Administrator of General Services, Washington, D.C.

Passed the Senate - February 28, 1984 by the following vote: 24 Ayes,  
2 Nays, 4 Not Voting

Passed the House - March 29, 1984 by the following vote: 32 Ayes,  
23 Nays, 5 Not Voting
