<u>Order of Business</u>: These bills are scheduled to be considered on Tuesday, October 1, 2013, under a motion to suspend the rules and pass the bills.

Summary: This collection of bills provides short-term funding through December 15, 2013, to a number of areas of government:

- Department of Interior and Others (<u>H.J. Res. 70</u>): This bill provides continuing appropriations through at FY2013 post-sequestration levels for a number of popular educational and recreational destinations including:
 - National Parks (Department of Interior)
 - United States Holocaust Memorial Museum
 - Smithsonian Institution
 - National Gallery of Art
- District of Columbia (<u>H.J. Res. 71</u>): This bill allows the District of Columbia to expend <u>local funds</u> (federal authorization through the annual appropriations process is required for this expenditure) for programs and activities under title IV, heading "District of Columbia Funds," of H.R. 2786 (text <u>here</u>) and under the authority and conditions provided in the recently expired FY2013 continuing resolution (H.R. 933, <u>P.L. 113-6</u>). - Veterans Affairs (<u>H.J. Res. 72</u>): This bill provides short term funding to be made available for the account General Operating Expenses, Veterans Benefits Administration consistent with the authority and conditions provided in the recently expired FY2013 continuing resolution (<u>P.L. 113-6</u>). The Veterans Benefits Administration is responsible for a variety of activities including compensation, pensions, and education assistance. Funding in this short-term bill is provided at an annual rate of \$2,455,490,000 billion compared to the annual funding rate of \$2,164,074,000 provided in P.L. 113-6. The funding rate provided

in this bill is consistent with the funding rate provided in the House-passed short-term continuing resolution for FY 2014, H.J. Res. 59.

Additional Background: During the 1995/1996 shutdown the Republican House similarly acted with short-term, targeted funding for non-controversial items including Veterans Affairs and the District of Columbia. Note: The District of Columbia has significant contingency reserve funds available (enough for nine days of operations) without action on this bill (memo from the District of Columbia here, Washington Post article on the \$144 million fund here)

Administration Position: The White House has issued a veto threat.
