## 1 SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE OF RULE.

(a) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Notwithstanding the effective date set forth in the rule submitted by the Department of Labor relating to exemptions regarding the rates
of pay for executive, administrative, professional, outside
sales, and computer employees (81 Fed. Reg. 32552 (May
23, 2016)), such rule shall not take effect until June 1,
2017.
