Grant: Americorps and Service Grants

Description: Grants cover a wide range of areas designed to promote service.

Description: Grants can be used for a variety of purposes to assist libraries and museums.

Grant: Access to Artistic Excellence Grant Program

Description: This program extends the arts to underserved populations, including to those whose opportunities to experience the arts are limited by economics, ethnicity, geography or disability.

Department: National Endowment for the Arts

Eligibility: Funding is available for projects consisting of one or more specific events or activities, from planning through implementation, and does not need to be a new project.

Grant: New Play Development Program (NPDP)

Description: This program supports artistic excellence in the theater by providing financial support for playwrights and institutions developing outstanding new American plays and advancing the development process for new work.

Eligibility: Playwrights must be a citizen or a permanent resident of the United States. Organizations and non-profits, state or local governments, and federally recognized tribal communities may also apply.

Grant: America's Historical and Cultural Organizations: Planning and Implementation Grants

Description: This program provides funding for projects that explore stories, ideas, and beliefs to deepen the understanding of our lives and our world, specifically those that explore reflection upon culture, identity and history.

Department: National Endowment for the Humanities

Eligibility: Implementation grants are for shovel ready projects for which a full walkthrough and presentation of ideas already exist.

Grant: Bridging Cultures: Planning and Implementing Grants for Academic Forums and Program Development Workshop

Description: This program encourages projects from around the globe and within America that expand scholarly and public discussion of diverse countries, peoples, intellectual and cultural traditions around the world.

Department: National Endowment for the Humanities

Eligibility: Non-profit organizations, public, academic institutions, museums, research libraries, disciplinary and professional associations, cultural institutions and institutions of higher learning. Individuals are not eligible to apply.

Grant: **Challenge Grants**

Description: This program provides funding for institutions and organizations to secure long-term improvements in support of its humanities programs. Funds may be used for one-time capital expenditures, such as construction and renovation that help secure long-term benefits to the institution and to the humanities.

Eligibility: Non-profit institutions working with or in part with the humanities, excluding elementary and secondary schools, may apply.

Grant: **Digital Humanities Startup Grants**

Description: This program encourages innovation in the digital humanities by awarding small grants to support the planning or initial stages of digital initiatives for the humanities. Funding may be used for planning and developing new digital tools for preserving, analyzing, and making accessible digital resources, including libraries and museums' digital assets, innovative technologies for public programming and education, and research on new approaches to best practices in the study of humanities.

Grant: **Humanities Collections and Reference Resources**

Description: This program provides foundation for scholarship, education, and public programming in the humanities. Funding supports efforts to preserve and extend the life of important collections of books and manuscripts, photographs, sound recordings and moving images, archeological and ethnographic artifacts, art and material culture, electronic records, and digital objects.

Eligibility: Non-profit organizations as well as state and local governments may apply. Individuals may not apply.

Grant: **Preservation and Access Education and Training**

Description: This program provides funding to assist in training the staff of cultural institutions to be effective stewards of humanities collections.

Eligibility: Non-profit organizations as well as state and local governments may apply. Individuals may not apply.

Grant: **Preservation and Access Research and Development**
Description: This program supports projects that address major challenges in preserving or providing access to humanities collections, such as the preservation of materials of critical importance to the nation's cultural heritage and to develop advanced modes of searching, discovering, and using such materials.

Grant: **Preservation Assistance Grants for Smaller Institutions**
Description: This program assists small and mid-sized institutions, such as libraries, museums, historical societies, town and county records offices and colleges and universities to improve their ability to preserve their humanities collections.

Eligibility: Non-profit organizations as well as state and local governments may apply. Individuals may not apply.

Grant: **Sustaining Cultural Heritage Collections**
Description: This program consists of two grants to assist cultural institutions in preserving large and diverse holdings of humanities materials by supporting preventive conservation measures to mitigate deterioration and prolong the useful life of collections. The first grant assists planning and development of a conservation plan, and the second grant is to be used for implementation.

Grant: **American Battlefield Protection Program (ABPP)**
Description: This program provides seed money up to \$80,000 for projects that identify or preserve battlefield land and/or historic sites associated with battlefields.

Department: National Park Service
Eligibility: Non-profit groups, academic institutions, local, regional, state, and tribal governments may apply. Applicants must demonstrate that the activity will directly contribute to the preservation of battlefield land or an associated site.

Grant: **Certified Local Government Grant Program (CLG)**

Description: This program assists local communities to be named a Certified Local Government (CLG) which provides access to state and Federal historic preservation funds and acts as a preservation partnership between local, state and Federal governments to focus on promoting historic preservation at the grassroots level.

Eligibility: Most local governments are eligible for consideration.

Grant: **National Center for Preservation Technology and Training (NCPTT)**

Description: This program provides a competitive matching grant for innovative projects that develop new technologies or adapt existing technologies to preserve cultural resources, such as documentation using new methods, laboratory or field research, and manuscript preservation techniques.

Eligibility: Government agencies, colleges and universities, and non-profits including museums, research laboratories and professional societies.

Grant: **Preserve America Grant Program**

Description: This program provides funding to assist local economies find self-sustaining ways to promote cultural resources through heritage tourism. Preserve America grants require a dollar-for-dollar match up to \$250,000 and should serve as models to communities nationwide for heritage tourism, education and economic development.

Grant: **Save America's Treasures Grant Program (SAT)**

Description: This program provides dollar-for-dollar matching grants for the preservation and/or conservation of nationally significant historic structures and sites.

Eligibility: Registered historic sites may apply and recipients are may not receive more than one grant.

Grant: **Grant Opportunities for Academic Liaison with Industry (GOALI)**

Description: This program promotes university-industry partnerships by making funds or fellowships available to support interactions between institutions of higher learning and industry.

Eligibility: Funds may only be provided to an academic institution, and only U.S. citizens, nationals, or permanent residents are eligible to apply.

Grant: **NSF Small Business Innovation Research Program (SBIR)**
Description: This program is intended to increase the incentive and opportunity for small businesses conducting cutting-edge, high risk, high quality scientific, engineering or science research that could have a high potential for economic payoff if research is successful.
Department: National Science Foundation
Eligibility: Small businesses, including joint ventures and partnerships which qualify as a small business, may apply. In addition, a minimum of two-thirds of the research must be performed by the small business.

Grant: **Global Climate Change Mitigation Incentive Fund (GCCMIF)**
Description: GCCMIF assistance is available to finance a variety of sustainability focused projects, including renewable energy end-products, the greening of existing manufacturing functions or processes, and the creation of certified green facilities.

Eligibility: States, units of local government or consortiums of local governments, institutions of higher education or consortiums; or public or private non-profit organization or association acting in cooperation with officials of a political subdivision of a State.

Grant: **National Construction Grant Program**
Description: This program provides funds for the construction of new, or expansion of existing, research science buildings.

Eligibility: Eligible recipients are institutions of higher education and non-profit science research organizations.

Description: This program supports the creation of afterschool programs that provide academic enrichment opportunities during non-school hours for children.

Description: This program provides grants to states to enable them to pay Advanced Placement test fees for low-income students.
