3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Community5 Counterterrorism Preparedness Act".

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subtitle A of title XX of the 5 Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 603 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end the following new section: 6 7 "SEC. 2009. MAJOR **METROPOLITAN** AREA 8 COUNTERTERRORISM TRAINING AND EXER-9 CISE GRANT PROGRAM.

10 "(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary, acting through the Administrator and the heads of other relevant 11 components of the Department, shall carry out a grant 12 program for emergency response providers to prevent, pre-13 14 pare for, and respond to the most likely terrorist attack scenarios, including active shooters, as determined by the 15 16 Secretary, against major metropolitan areas.

17 "(b) ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS.—Emergency response
18 providers and jurisdictions that are currently receiving, or
19 that previously received, funding under section 2003 may
20 apply for a grant under the program established in sub21 section (a).

23 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Eligible applicants de24 scribed in subsection (b) may apply for a grant
25 under this section, and shall submit such informa-

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1	tion in support of an application as the Adminis-					
2	trator many require.					
3	"(2) MINIMUM CONTENTS OF APPLICATION.—					
4	The Administrator shall require that each applicant					
5	include in its application at a minimum, the fol-					
6	lowing:					
7	"(A) The purpose for which the applicant					
8	seeks grant funds, including a description of					
9	how the applicant plans to use such funds.					
10	"(B) A description of how the activity for					
11	which the funding is sought will prepare the ap-					
12	plicant to prevent, prepare for, and respond to					
13	complex, coordinated attacks.					
14	"(C) Such other information as determined					
15	necessary by the Administrator.					
16	"(d) PERMITTED USES.—The recipient of a grant					
17	under this section may use such grant to conduct training					
18	and exercises consistent with preventing, preparing for,					
19	and responding to the most likely terrorist attack sce-					
20	narios, including active shooters.					
21	"(e) PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE.—The Administrator					
22	shall make funds provided under this section available for					
23	use by a recipient of a grant for a period of not fewer					
24	than 24 months.					

"(f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
 are authorized to be appropriated for grants under this
 section \$39,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2017 through
 2022.".
