I am writing today to invite all high school students from Michigan's 10th Congressional District to participate in the annual Congressional Art Competition, "*An Artistic Discovery*". Established by Members of the U.S. House of Representatives in 1982, this competition is a nationwide annual event that allows students from across the country to exhibit their artwork and receive national recognition. The contest provides an excellent opportunity to recognize the rich artistic talent of our nation's students.

The winning entry from the 10th Congressional District of Michigan will be displayed in an eleven month exhibit in the Cannon Tunnel that leads into the U.S. Capitol. The winner and an adult chaperone (parent/guardian) will be invited to a ribbon cutting ceremony taking place in June 2016, in Washington, D.C. and the winner will be awarded a \$1,500 scholarship (per year) from the Savannah College of Art and Design. In April, we will be holding a local exhibition as a part of this competition to display all the pieces entered into this year's competition. This month-long exhibition will take place at Studio 1219 in Port Huron, Michigan. Details on this event will be announced in the coming weeks.

Congressional Art Competition Guidelines 2016 U.S. Representative Candice S. Miller

General Guidelines

- The competition is open to high school students only.
- Each High School may submit up to 20 pieces
- Participants must reside in or attend a high school in Michigan's Tenth Congressional District
- Official resources are to be used only to the extent authorized by the Committee on House Administration and the Committee on Standards of Official Conduct.
- In order to allow a work of art to hang in the Cannon Tunnel of the U.S. Capitol, the following restrictions are necessary:
 - Two-Dimensional only
 - Each work of art can be no longer than 28 inches by 28 inches to the outside dimensions of the frame.
 - Artwork can not be more than 4 inches in depth
 - Artwork cannot weight more than 15 lbs.
- Artwork will hang in the Capitol for the entire year of the exhibition and cannot be returned to students earlier. Student, therefore, should submit artwork they will not need for other purposes.
- Art work categories are as follows:
 - Paintings (oil, acrylics, watercolor, etc.)
 - Drawings (pastels, colored pencils, pencil, charcoal, ink, markers, etc.)
 - Collage: must be two dimensional
 - Prints (lithographs, silkscreen, block prints)
 - Mixed media: use of more than two mediums such as pencils, ink, etc.
 - Computer generated art
 - Photography
- Each entry must be an original in concept, design and execution and may not violate any U.S. copyright laws.
 - An attached form must be signed by the teacher and the student to certify the originality of the piece.
 - NOTE: Any entry which has been produced from an existing photo, painting, graphic, advertisement or any other work produced by another person is a violated of the competition rules and **WILL NOT** be accepted!
- If the artwork is abstract in design, please indicate on the backside which side is "up" with arrows.

The final decision regarding suitability for the exhibition in the Capitol will be made by a panel of qualified persons chaired by the Architect of the Capitol.

PLEASE NOTE

WINNING PIECE WILL BE FRAMED. ARTWORK DOES NOT NEED TO BE FRAMED TO BE SUBMITTED – BUT MUST MEET OTHER CRITERIA/DIMENSIONS!

As directed by the House Oversight and Standards of Official Conduct Committees, each district winner is responsible for framing his or her winning entry. Any hardship cases should be assisted at the district level; works cannot be framed by the Architect of the Capitol.

- A TYPED copy of the Student Information Release Form, signed by both the teacher and the student, must be attached to the back of the artwork to certify the originality of the piece. (Electronic copies are available upon request).
- Each work must have a label with this information securely applied to the back:
