MACDILL AIR FORCE BASE, Fla. - Exercise Eagle Resolve, ongoing in Kuwait through March, has featured demonstrations of military skill across a range of scenarios. These have included a simulated mass casualty event; a hostage rescue scenario; close quarters battle; visit, board, search and seizure training at sea; and water survival training.

Eagle Resolve includes more than 5,500 troops participating from 29 countries.
