Over a month ago, Governor Brown officially declared a drought emergency in our State amidst declining reservoir levels and historically low amounts of rainfall. Despite our recent rainfall, the state still faces a serious situation. The Governor has asked that everyone reduce their water usage by 20 percent.

A simple way to achieve this reduction is to cut back on overwatering and be extra mindful of your daily water usage. I am glad to see <u>the City of Cypress</u> is promoting this practice throughout Orange County. I encourage you and your community to take responsible steps in promoting and practicing water security during this time of drought.

On Thursday, the Long Beach Board of Water Commissioners took proactive steps in reducing our water use, restricting lawn watering to Mondays, Thursdays, or Saturdays. In addition, Long Beach has ongoing prohibitions on watering between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. and hosing down sidewalks and driveways without specialized hoses. Increasing awareness and encouraging conservation will be critical as we deal with the status of our State's water supply.

We may also be experiencing flash floods this weekend. While this may bring some drought relief, it can pose serious threats to our community. Please be extra safe this weekend!

This week I signed Congressman Timothy Bishop's "discharge petition" to vote on The Fair Minimum Wage Act, which would raise the federal minimum wage from \$7.25 to \$10.10 per hour. If the petition reaches 218 signatures, the proposal will be brought to the House Floor for an immediate vote.

"Speaker of the House, and Majority and Minority Leader"

The Speaker of the House, a member of the Majority party, is the presiding officer in the House of Representatives, and is responsible for the day-to-day functions of the House, as well as advancing the legislative agenda of his political party. Should an emergency occur, the U.S. Constitution names the Speaker of the House as second in the line of succession to the Presidency, after the Vice President. The Speaker of the House in the 113th Congress is Speaker John Boehner, a Republican from Ohio.

In addition to the Speaker, the majority Republicans and minority Democrats in the House each have their own party leadership positions known as Leaders, who each serve as their party's principal spokesperson and legislative strategist.

The Majority Leader in the 113th Congress is Republican Eric Cantor from Virginia. The Minority Leader in the 113th Congress is Democrat Nancy Pelosi from California, who, herself, served as speaker from 2007 to 2011.
