It was also my distinct pleasure to be invited to tour the Los Alamitos Joint Forces Training Base Sunburst and STARBASE academies this week where I met with teachers and students involved in these two important programs.

The Sunburst Youth Challenge Program is a community high school, run by the California National Guard in partnership with the Orange County Department of Education. The Academy is a 5 1/2 month long residential "military style" academy structured to promote an academic environment where students: earn high school credits; develop leadership, cooperation, and academic skills; and, improve self-esteem, pride, and confidence.

The STARBASE program is run at student academies set up on existing military bases and focuses on elementary students, primarily fifth graders. The goal of the program is to motivate these students to explore Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) as they continue their education. The academies serve students that are historically under-represented in STEM. Students who live in inner cities or rural locations, those who are socio-economically disadvantaged, low in academic performance or have a disability are in the target group.



This critical program was threatened with elimination during the recent process to pass a continuing resolution to keep the government funded.

To prevent this, I wrote letters to the Senate leadership of both parties

explaining the importance of the program and asking that its funding not be cut.

In the final version of the continuing resolution that passed both houses, the funding for the STARBASE program was restored.

I wanted to extend my thanks to Long Beach City Council member Patrick O'Donnell for inviting me to address a contingent of his 4th District constituents at his monthly "Chat with Pat" event. It was great getting to hear from residents of the 4th District and let them know what has been going on in Washington.



## Equal Pay Day and Townhall


