In May, I traveled to Ukraine, met with Ukrainian government and community leaders, and visited the eastern area near the site where Malaysia Airlines Flight 17 was shot down last week.

The recent roots of the Flight 17 tragedy are directly connected to the Russian annexation of Crimea and Moscow's continued support of separatists in the eastern region of Ukraine.

While the investigation into the attack on Flight 17 is far from complete, even at this early stage indications are that the Moscow-backed separatists are likely responsible.

The nearly 300 people aboard Flight 17 were innocent victims and my heart goes out to their families. Just as so many times throughout history, it is increasingly likely that the innocent have paid with their lives for the personal and political ambitions of a reckless few.


Stanton Coffee

"Calendars"

Congress runs, to some degree, on calendars. The **House Calendar** is a calendar in the House of Representatives that schedules major bills which don't involve money. The calendar can also be defined as a list of all bills reported from committee and eligible for floor action, except bills pertaining to taxation and spending.

The **Union Calendar** is a separate calendar in the House that schedules bills involving money issues. It arose from the requirement in Article One of the United States Constitution that all revenue bills originate in the House of Representatives.

The House Calendar is set by the majority leadership. Currently, House Majority Leader Eric Cantor's office maintains the calendar.
