Mr. ELLISON introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Financial Services

A BILL

To amend the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduc-
tion Act of 1992 to define environmental intervention
blood lead level.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Lead-Safe Housing
5 for Kids Act of 2007”.

6 **SEC. 2. AMENDING THE RESIDENTIAL LEAD-BASED PAINT**
7 **HAZARD REDUCTION ACT OF 1992.**

8 Section 1017 of the Residential Lead-Based Paint
9 Hazard Reduction Act (42 U.S.C. 4852c) is amended—

1 (a) by striking “Not later than” and inserting “(a)
2 IN GENERAL.—Not later than” with appropriate indenta-
3 tion; and

4 (b) by adding at the end the following new subsection:

5 “(b) ENVIRONMENTAL INTERVENTION BLOOD LEAD
6 LEVEL.—For the purpose of this Act, and any regulations
7 issued under this Act, an environmental intervention blood
8 lead level shall be a confirmed concentration of lead in
9 whole blood equal to or greater than 10 ug/dL
10 (micrograms of lead per deciliter) for a single test.”.

11 **SEC. 3. FEDERAL REGULATIONS.**

12 The Secretary of Housing and Urban Development
13 shall amend the regulations of such department to comply
14 with the amendments made by section 2 not later than
15 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act.
