

Applicants should keep the following in mind as they proceed through the U.S. Service Academies Congressional Nominations application process:

- 1. Applying to any of the service academies is a two-tiered process. All applicants must first open an application with any and all Academies they have an interest in attending. The applicant at the same time needs to apply for a Congressional Nomination through Congressman Huizenga's office.
 - Each Member of Congress is entitled to fill five vacancies at each Service Academy. When a vacancy is filled, the cadet is then "charged" to the Second Congressional district of Michigan. Congressman Huizenga is allowed to nominate young men and woman to a particular Academy when a vacancy occurs in one of these charged slots, either by reason of graduation or withdrawal.
- 2. For each vacancy Congressman Huizenga is able nominate up to ten candidates for admission. One of these nominees will be offered an appointment to fill the vacancy by the academy. The other nominees, assuming they meet the Academy's minimum requirements, are placed into a nationwide qualified candidate pool. At that point, it is left to the discretion of the Academy to choose candidates to fill the remaining slots in its incoming class.

- 4. Applications <u>MUST</u> be received in my Grandville District office by <u>5:00pm October</u> <u>31, 2016</u>. If October 31st falls on a weekend, the applications will be due the following Monday by 5:00pm. <u>Under no circumstances will Congressman</u> <u>Huizenga accept late applications</u>.
- 5. The applicant will be contacted regarding an interview with Congressman Huizenga's Academy Advisory Board once the application deadline has passed. Interviews will be scheduled on the first Friday in December.

Nomination Requirements:

- 1. Completed Application
- 2. Completed Essay
 - In 500-750 words please describe why you want to attend an Untied States Service Academy. In this essay please also include what makes you a good candidate for a nomination.
- 3. Official Academic Transcripts
 - Please submit an Official Transcript from any High School and College attended since 9th grade.
 - o Include class rank
- 4. ACT/SAT Scores
 - o May be included on Official Transcripts
 - o SAT Code: 1634
 - o ACT Code: 7466
- 5. A current photograph of the applicant
- 6. Three Letters of Recommendation
 - o Only 3, no more or less.
 - Letters of Reference should arrive in sealed envelopes within your application packet.
 - Those persons used as references should not be relatives of the applicant.
 High school instructors, high school guidance counselors, coaches, and former employers are preferred.
- 7. A Current Resume
- 8. Signed Authorization form
 - On bottom of application

Notes:

• All application material should be submitted together in a single package (with the potential exception of official SAT/ACT scores). The enclosure of unsolicited material may not be used for consideration for a Congressional Nomination.

December 2, 2016 Interviews with Congressman Huizenga's Academy Board.

December 3 - 31, 2016 Congressional office to notify candidates about their nomination

status

December 2016 Nomination forms are prepared and sent to each academy, and

nominees' names are released to the press

February - April 2017 Nominees will hear from the Academies about admission.

June – July 2017 Cadets/Midshipmen from the Class of 2021 report to their academy

Frequently Asked Questions on Service Academy Nominations

What are the basic eligibility requirements?

Each applicant for a nomination must meet the following eligibility requirements as of July 1st of the year of admission to an academy:

- Age: Be at least 17 years old, but not have passed the 23rd birthday
- Citizenship: Must be a U.S. citizen
- Marital Status: Must be unmarried, not pregnant, and without legal obligation to support children or other dependents
- Residence: In order to receive a nomination from Congressman Huizenga, applicant must reside within the boundaries of the 2^{nd} Congressional District of Michigan
- Skill / Fitness: Must meet the medical, physical, and academic requirements of the Academy

What is a nomination?

Members of Congress may nominate applicants who meet the eligibility requirements established by law. A candidate may seek a nomination from the following:

- A member of the U.S. House of Representatives who represents the congressional district in which the candidate resides
- Both U.S. Senators from his or her state
- The Vice-President of the United States

It is in your best interest to request a nomination from any available source.

What is the difference between a nomination and an appointment?

A nomination is the authority from a nominating source (see above) for a candidate to be considered for entrance by an academy. An appointment is the actual slot for admission from the candidate's preferred academy.

Who do I contact to request an application for nomination from Congressman Huizenga? Contact Matt Kooiman in Congressman Huizenga's Grandville Office at (616) 570-0917 to request a nomination application packet.

When do I apply for a nomination?

Nomination application period opens April of each year for those candidates who are high school juniors and will be seniors the following school year, or who have already graduated.

What is the deadline for completing a nomination file?

The deadline for submitting a nomination packet to my District Office is <u>October 31, 2016</u> for students entering academies in the summer of 2017.

Does Congressman Huizenga accept late applications?

No; Congressman Huizenga does not accept nomination applications after October 31st.

What must be included in my nomination file?

A complete nomination file consists of the following items:

- Completed Application
- Completed Essay
- Official Academic Transcripts from all schools you attended (High School and College)
- ACT/SAT Scores (May be included on Official Transcripts)
- A current photograph of the applicant
- Three Letters of Recommendation
- A Current Resume (include extracurricular activities and employment dating back to 9th grade)
- Signed Authorization form

What happens after I have completed my nomination file?

Applicants who submit a completed nomination file will be scheduled for an interview on the first Friday in December. After the interviews (typically within 2-3 weeks), candidates will be notified in writing of the result of their nomination.

What criteria are used in selecting candidates?

Nominations are based on a "whole person" evaluation. Factors such as academic achievements, extra-curricular activities, leadership skills, physical aptitude, character, motivation, and the results of interviews are taken into consideration and compared with other applicants.

Does Congressman Huizenga automatically nominate everyone who applies?

No. Applicants will be evaluated and only offered a nomination if their application is competitive.

Can I be nominated by Congressman Huizenga to multiple academies?

Yes. You can be nominated to multiple academies depending on how well you have competed among the year's pool of candidates. It is also possible to win multiple appointments. Be sure to rank on your application the academies which you would like to attend if nominated.

How many academies are there?

There are five service academies.

- <u>U.S. Military Academy [at West Point]</u>, New York
- <u>U.S. Naval Academy</u> at Annapolis, Maryland
- <u>U.S. Air Force Academy</u> at Colorado Springs
- <u>U.S. Merchant Marine Academy</u> at Kings Point, New York
- U.S. Coast Guard Academy at New London, Connecticut

Are the requirements the same for all of the service academies?

No. Although many of the qualifications are similar, each academy operates under its own admissions guidelines. Visit the academy of your choice via their websites for each academy's particular admissions qualifications. It is not necessary to seek a nomination to the Coast Guard Academy, as the U.S.C.G.A. accepts candidates based on their own testing criteria.

Who should I ask to write a letter of recommendation on my behalf?

Some of the people applicants typically seek recommendations from include:

- Teachers
- Counselors
- Employers
- Coaches
- Clergy
- Scout Leaders

Will I automatically be selected by the academy after I receive a nomination?

No. You will be placed among a select group of nominees, and the academy will make the final decision. If selected, you will receive an offer of admission (an appointment) directly from the academy.

When will I know if I have been offered an appointment by an academy?

Academies will begin to notify candidates of their admission status in February. All offers of appointment are generally sent out by May. Several academies offer rolling appointments, and you may know as early as October or as late as May if you are receiving an appointment.
