

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

A PROCLAMATION

Whereas, public interests require that the Congress of the United States should be convened in extra session at 12 o'clock, noon, on the 9th day of March, 1933, to receive such communication as may be made by the Executive.

Executive. Now, therefore, I, Franklin D. Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, do hereby proclaim and declare that an extraordinary occasion requires the Congress of the United States to convene in extra session at the Capitol in the city of Washington on the 9th day of March, 1933, at 12 o'clock, noon, of which all persons who shall at that time be entitled to act as Members thereof are hereby required to take notice. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of the United States. Done at the city of Washington this 5th day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and of the independence of the United States the one hundred and fifty-seventh.

RESTRICTION OF POWER TO REPORT APPROPRIATIONS

Clause 4, rule XXI: "4. No bill or joint resolution carrying appropriations shall be reported by any committee not having jurisdiction to report appropriations, nor shall an amendment proposing an appropriation be in order during the consideration of a bill or joint resolution reported by a committee not having that jurisdiction. A question of order on an appropriation in any such bill, joint resolution, or amendment thereto may be raised at any time."

THE MORNING HOUR FOR THE CALL OF COMMITTEES

Clause 4, rule XXIV: "4. After the unfinished business has been disposed of, the Speaker shall call each standing committee in regular order, and then select committees, and each committee when named may call up for consideration any bill reported by it on a previous day and on the House Calendar, and if the Speaker shall not complete the call of the committees before the House passes to other business, he shall resume the next call where he left off, giving preference to the last bill under consideration: *Provided*, That whenever any committee shall have occupied the morning hour on 2 days it shall not be in order to call up any other bill until the other committees have been called in their turn.

CALENDAR WEDNESDAY BUSINESS

Clause 7, rule XXIV: "7. On Wednesday of each week no business shall be in order except as provided by paragraph 4 of this rule unless the House by a two thirds vote on motion to dispense therewith shall otherwise determine. On such a motion there may be debate not to exceed 5 minutes for and against. On a call of committees under this under the rules; but bills called up from either the House or the Union Calendar, excepting bills which are privileged under the rules; but bills called up from the Union Calendar shall be considered in Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union. This rule shall not apply during the last 2 weeks of the session. It shall not be in order for the Speaker to entertain a motion for a recess on any Wednesday except during the last 2 "Provided, That not more than 2 hours of general debate shall be permitted on any measure called up on

Calendar Wednesday, and all debate must be confined to the subject matter of the bill, the time to be equally divided between those for and against the bill: *Provided further*, That whenever any committee shall have occupied one Wednesday it shall not be in order, unless the House by a two thirds vote shall otherwise determine, to consider any unfinished business previously called up by such committee, unless the previous question had been ordered thereon, upon any succeeding Wednesday until the other committees have been called in their turn under this rule: *Provided*, That when, during any one session of Congress, all of the committees of the House are not called under the Calendar Wednesday rule, at the next session of Congress the call shall commence where it left off at the end of the preceding session.

CONFEREES MAY NOT AGREE TO CERTAIN SENATE AMENDMENTS

Clause 2, Rule XX: "2. No amendment of the Senate to a general appropriation bill which would be in violation of the provisions of clause 2 of rule XXI, if said amendment had originated in the House, nor any amendment of the Senate providing for an appropriation upon any bill other than a general appro-priation bill, shall be agreed to by the managers on the part of the House unless specific authority to agree to such amendment shall be first given by the House by a separate vote on every such amend-ment."

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CALENDAR OF MOTIONS TO DISCHARGE COMMITTEES

Clause 4, Rule XXVII: "4. A Member may present to the Clerk a motion in writing to discharge a committee from the consideration of a public bill or resolution which has been referred to it 30 days prior thereto (but only one motion may be presented for each bill or resolution). Under this rule it shall also be in order for a Member to file a motion to discharge the Committee on Rules from further consideration order for a Member to file a motion to discharge the Committee on Rules from further consideration of any resolution providing either a special order of business, or a special rule for the consideration of any public bill or resolution favorably reported by a standing committee, or a special rule for the con-sideration of a public bill or resolution which has remained in a standing committee 30 or more days without action: *Provided*, That said resolution from which it is moved to discharge the Com-mittee on Rules has been referred to that committee at least seven days prior to the filing of the motion to discharge. The motion shall be placed in the custody of the Clerk, who shall arrange some convenient place for the signature of Members. A signature may be withdrawn by a Member in writing at any time before the motion, it shall be entered on the Journal, printed with the signatures thereto in the Congressional Record, and referred to the Calendar of Motions to Dis-charge Committees. charge Committees.

On the second and fourth Mondays of each month, except during the last six days of any session of Congress, immediately after the approval of the Journal, any Member who has signed a session of Congress, immediately after the approval of the Journal, any Member who has signed a motion to discharge which has been on the calendar at least seven days prior thereto, and seeks recognition, shall be recognized for the purpose of calling up the motion, and the House shall pro-ceed to its consideration in the manner herein provided without intervening motion except one motion to adjourn. Recognition for the motions shall be in the order in which they have been entered on

to adjourn. Recognition for the motions shall be in the order in which they have been entered on the Journal. "When any motion under this rule shall be called up, the bill or resolution shall be read by title only. After 20 minutes' debate, one-half in favor of the proposition and one-half in opposition, thereto, the House shall proceed to vote on the motion to discharge. If the motion prevails to discharge the Committee on Rules from any resolution pending before the committee, the House shall immediately vote on the adoption of said resolution, the Speaker not entertaining any dilatory or other intervening motion except one motion to adjourn, and, if said resolution is adopted, then the House shall imme-diately proceed to its execution. If the motion prevails to discharge one of the standing committees of the House from any public bill or resolution pending before the committee, it shall then be in order for any Member who signed the motion to move that the House proceed to the immediatel considera-tion of such bill or resolution not being debatable), and such motion is hereby made of high privilege; and if it shall be decided in the affirmative, the bill shall be immediately considered under the general rules of the House, and if unfinished before adjournment of the day on which it is called up it shall remain the unfinished business until it is fully disposed of. Should the House by vote decide against the immediate consideration of such bill or resolution, it shall be referred to its called up it shall remain the unnnished business until it is fully disposed of. Should the House by vote decide against the immediate consideration of such bill or resolution, it shall be referred to its proper calendar and be entitled to the same rights and privileges that it would have had had the com-mittee to which it was referred duly reported same to the House for its consideration: *Provided*, That when any perfected motion to discharge a committee from the consideration of any public bill or resolution has once been acted upon by the House it shall not be in order to entertain during the same session of Congress any other motion for the discharge from that committee of said measure, or from shy other committee of any other hill or resolution substantially the same relating in substance to any other committee of any other bill or resolution substantially the same, relating in substance to or dealing with the same subject matter, or from the Committee on Rules of a resolution providing a special order of business for the consideration of any other such bill or resolution, in order that such action by the House on a motion to discharge shall be res adjudicata for the remainder of that such action by the house on a motion to discharge shall be res adjudicata for the remainder of that session: *Provided, further*, That if before any one motion to discharge a committee has been acted upon by the House there are on the Calendar of Motions to Discharge Committees other motions to dis-charge committees from the consideration of bills or resolutions substantially the same, relating in substance to or dealing with the same subject matter, after the House shall have acted on one motion to discharge, the remaining said motions shall be stricken from the Calendar on Motions to Discharge Committees and not acted on during the remainder of that session of Congress."

JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SEVENTY-SECOND CONGRESS

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the following article is hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by conventions in three-fourths of the several States:

"ARTICLE-

"SECTION 1. The eighteenth article of amendment to the Constitution of the United States is hereby

repealed. "SEC. 2. The transportation or importation into any State, Territory, or possession of the United States for delivery or use therein of intoxicating liquors, in violation of the laws thereof, is hereby prohibited. "SEC. 3. This article shall be inoperative unless it shall have been ratified as an amendment to the Con-stitution by conventions in the several States, as provided in the Constitution, within seven years from the date of the submission hereof to the States by the Congress."

The total laws of the first session, Seventy-third Congress, numbered 105, which were divided as follows House bills 46, House joint resolutions 7, Senate bills 48, and Senate joint resolutions 4. Of the 48 Senate bills and 4 Senate joint resolutions which became laws, 8 bills and 1 joint resolution were enacted in lieu of an equal number of House bills and House joint resolution, respectively, which had been reported from committees and which were laid on the table to facilitate the enactment of the legislation.

Exclusive of the bill which failed to become law through lack of signature after adjournment of the Congress, the House passed 5 House bills and 3 House joint resolutions which did not become laws. There were introduced in the Senate 1,955 bills, 64 joint resolutions, 5 concurrent resolutions, and 103

simple resolutions.

The Senate passed 106 Senate bills and 9 Senate joint resolutions. The Senate committees made 146 reports.

The Senate passed 58 Senate bills and 5 Senate joint resolutions which did not become laws. Of these, 9 Senate bills were pending on House calendars, and 41 Senate bills and 1 Senate joint resolution were pending in House committees.

Nine Senate bills and 2 Senate joint resolutions were indefinitely postponed in the Senate because similar House bills had become laws or were further advanced in the process of becoming laws. One bill failed to become law through lack of signature after adjournment of the Congress.

There were 38 bills entered upon the Consent Calendar, of which 33 were acted upon, leaving 5 upon the calendar.

Seven motions to discharge committees from consideration of bills were filed, but did not receive a sufficient number of signatures for entry on the calendar of such motions.

The President transmitted to the House 22 messages; executive departments transmitted 108 communications. Petitions filed numbered 1,403.

The total laws of the Congress numbered 976 which were divided as follows: House bills 533, House joint resolutions 33, Senate bills 388, and Senate joint resolutions 22. Of the 388 Senate bills and 22 Senate joint resolutions which became laws, 119 bills and 5 joint resolutions were enacted in lieu of House bills, House joint resolutions, and a House concurrent resolution, which had been reported from committees and which were laid on the table to facilitate the enactment of the legislation. Exclusive of bills vetoed, the House passed 88 House bills, and 6 House joint resolutions and 5 Senate bills and 5 Senate

bills which did not become laws

There were introduced in the Senate 3,806 bills, 144 joint resolutions, 24 concurrent resolutions, and 279 simple resolutions.

Sixty-two Senate bills and 4 Senate joint resolutions were indefinitely postponed in the Senate because similar House bills had become laws or were further advanced in the process of becoming laws.

Thirty-nine House bills, one House joint resolution, 31 Senate bills and one Senate joint resolution were vetoed of which one act was subsequently passed over the veto.

There were 492 bills entered upon the Consent Calendar, of which 398 were acted upon, leaving 56 upon the calendar.

Thirty-one motions to discharge committees from consideration of bills were filed, of which 6 were entered on the calendar of such motions and 25 did not receive a sufficient number of signatures for such entry. Of the 6 so entered on the calendar, 2 prevailed and 4 remained on the Discharge Calendar. The President transmitted to the House 88 messages; executive departments transmitted 504 communica-

tions. Petitions filed numbered 5,201.
